ADDRESS ELECTORS

MELZAR AVERY HAS ISSUED HIS VIEWS.

His Work in the Past Warrants Consideration—Conspirators in Tory Camp—Appealing Now For Fair Play.

To the Electors of Frontenac:— In presenting my name to you for reelection to the House of Commons, I do so with the conviction that I am entitled to your support and confidence. I need no introduction to you and am satisfied that my work in the past as your representative, warrants some consideration at your hands. Why am I a candidate? That question has been asked me on several occasions and I take this opportunity of clearly defining my position. At a conference held in Kingston in July, 1907, at which the party whip, George Taylor, myself, Dr. Edwards and the principal officers of the county association were present, it was laid down by the whip that the county convention was not to be held till after the dissolution of the House, and that in any case the sitting member (myself) was to be consulted and his advice asked as to the date. This was agreed to and I left the meeting convinced that I would be in touch with any plans for the calling together of delegates.

But this compact was broken and a convention called for the month of October. I was not consulted, I was not even notified till a date so near the one set for the gathering that I was unable to take the ordinary precautions to protect myself. It was a convention called in opposition to all the rules laid down to govern the same. I was inclined to consult President Langwith equally with the secretary, Dr. Edwards, but I have of late learned that the step he took was due to false information given him, that he was misled by those who wished to benefit thereby. The convention was a packed one. The delegates were unfairly selected by those anxious to secure the vote for Dr. Edwards, and notwithstanding all my protests and appeals for fair play, for a postponement in order to have delegates properly named, the date was cast and my opponent carried the day.

The result was that I was sent back to Ottawa for the final session with the record of a man repudiated by his own party. I could not tell every man I met the circumstances of the case, I could not explain my position to the people on the street. Nevertheless I felt keenly the slight that had been laid upon me. Had the convention been called in a regular manner and in accordance with the lines laid down by George Taylor, and had the delegates been selected in sympathy with the rules of all properly conducted organizations, I would have had no grievance, and cheerfully abided by the result.

When I learned that the Liberals did not intend giving Dr. Edwards the position accorded me. I am in this fight appealing for fair play. I ask from the electors, as a whole, a vote on the issue. I refuse to be bound by the decision of the small convention of October, 1907, and ask for a verdict from a convention of the people of the whole county. I feel I am right, that I am on safe ground, that I am simply doing what any other man who has self-respect would do.

Dr. Edwards has boasted of his loyalty to his party. Did he support me in the campaign of 1904? I solicited him to aid me on the stump and he refused. I communicated with him by mail (registered letter) and he did not even have the common courtesy to reply to the same. Two days prior to polling, I asked him to take the chair at the Catarqui meeting held on my behalf and he turned his back on the offer. Even at that late date I held out the olive branch and it was not accepted. My position is a clear one. I have been fair and above board and I expect that the electors will give me that consideration to which I am entitled.

MELZAR AVERY. GAVE FINE RECITAL.

Programme at Sydenham Street Church.

The solos of Mrs. Small were rendered with good effect and much appreciation. Her numbers were "With Verdure Clad" (from The Creation), Haydn, and "Sleep" (Blumenthal). Prof. Small's organ solos were well rendered, and included "Introduction to 3rd Act of Lohengrin" and "Bridal March" (Wagner); organ solo (a) Romanza (b) Allegro Maestoso (from 1st Sonata da Camera).

Another recital will be given on Nov. 16th.

Prof. James Small was born in Glasgow in 1876, and is a son of David Small, artist on the staff of the Dundee Advertiser, who himself is a musician of no mean order. Mr. Small studied the piano under the noted pianist, Lamont, of Glasgow, and the organ under S. C. Hirst, Dundee. He has been organist successively of Downfield Free church, Princess Street Congregational church, Dundee; Queen Street United Free church, Broughty Ferry, five years, and St. John's United Free church, Dundee, six years, of which church a brother of W. B. T. MacCaulay, first minister of Westmount Academy, Rev. Dr. MacCaulay, is pastor. Prof. Small was one of the few Scotch organists invited to give a week's recital on the Grand hall organ at the Glasgow exhibition in 1901.

In accepting Mr. Small's resignation the St. John's United Free church expressed its "deep regret at his departure, and gratefully acknowledged the high quality of the services he had rendered to St. John's in connection with the public worship of the church.
