**PICTON'S NEW SCHOOL**  
**THE WORK IS BEING PUSH-ED AHEAD.**

Petition to Go to Picton Council Asking That By-Law As to Local Option Be Submitted to the Ratepayers.

Picton, Oct. 27.—The building of the new ward school is fast going ahead. Within a very short time the masons will have completed their work. The building is now ready for the roof. The workmen have been especially favored with fine weather since the work on the school commenced, and no delays have been suffered on this account. There is every expectation that the school will be ready for occupancy by the first of the next term, for as soon as the building is enclosed work can be kept on the go in the interior finishing. The new school is a substantial, fine-looking building of two stories. There will be two rooms on each floor. Each will accommodate sixty pupils, a total of one hundred and twenty. There was a time when twenty-five was a big attendance at the ward school, but the growing population in Tecumseh ward has made more accommodation necessary. It is not doubted that the school now being erected will have much vacant space.


Those who are making local option have handed in their petition to Town Clerk Norman, to be presented at the next meeting of the town council. It is understood that there are about four hundred names on the petition, representing voters of the town, and, besides, many others who have not a vote. The petition is only to have the town fathers submit a by-law at the January municipal election to have the electorate decide whether or not local option shall rule in Picton.

At tomorrow afternoon's police court Magistrate Currie will hear three cases brought by License Inspector Sexsmith for infringements against the liquor license act by those who have been "listed." All three offenders are town men. Inspector Sexsmith states that there are now fifty-three Pictonians listed.

Brit is to box Summers ten rounds in London on November 2nd.

Canada won the Olympic increase game from England by 14 to 10, Longboat, the Canadian Indian runner, is exceptionally strong at putting the shot.

The Australian rugby team which will play a series of games in England are known as "The Rabbits."

Am Princeton a scoreless game was the outcome of a desperate encounter on the gridiron between Princeton and Syracuse university.

Toronto World: In the college league Queen's keeps on space and will likely continue leaders till they take their annual trouncing on Varsity field.

Champion Miss May Sutton, with A. V. Duncan as a printer, will shortly appear as a contestant in the Mexico lawn tennis tourney now in progress.

Vancouver's rugby team will play five games at San Francisco, two each against the Stanford and California university teams, and one against a picked team.

Christy Mathewson is one of the busiest pitchers the game ever knew. In his eight years of professional ball he has pitched 312 games, winning 209, and losing 103, for a grand percentage of .669.

After the Marathon race in England from Windsor Castle to Saphera's Bush, it was sagely suggested that Tom Longboat take to the reservation. His latest victory in Montreal will now compel the critics to admit that the Indian's place is properly in the limelight as the greatest long distance runner the world has ever seen.

At Buffalo Alf. Shrubbs, the English distance runner, defeated a relay team composed of two Yankees and one Canadian in a five-mile race. On the relay team Allen, of Buffalo, ran one and one-half miles, Mayhnan, the Hamilton, Ont., Indian, two miles, Shrubbs led from the start, winning by half a mile. His time was 42:45, 10:13 2-5, 15:16, 21:08, 26:10 3-5.

Arrangements have been completed by the Ottawa college team to play the St. Lawrence University, Mass., at the capital on Thanksgiving day. The game will be played under both American and Canadian rules, one half each way. A large number of American students in the game, some of whom have made the football team, will be a factor in favor of the locals.

Hans Wagner recently invested his year's salary in Carnegie real estate. The Flying Dutchman is, without doubt, one of the richest players in the game, with the addition of his new purchases. He is a bank director, a big holder of brewery bonds, railroad bonds, owns a business block and bowling alley, as well as a large chicken farm, two automobiles and about thirty blooded dogs.

**HE HAS RESIGNED.**  
 Held Office in New York Society For 17 Years.



**Dr. Charles H. Parkhurst**

New York, Oct. 27.—Rev. Charles Parkhurst, D.D., has resigned the presidency of the Society for the Prevention of Crime, an office which he has held for seventeen years. Rev. Dr. Parkhurst became president of the society through a sermon that he preached on municipal politics in 1890, at the Madison Square Presbyterian church, of which he is the pastor. The late Rev. Dr. Howard Crosby, who was then president, was so impressed that he invited Dr. Parkhurst to begin a determined campaign against trafficking in liquor on the Sabbath, and against gambling. Dr. Parkhurst's activity brought down on his head an equal amount of praise and criticism. But he continued in his work and many times made startling charges against officials of the police department.
