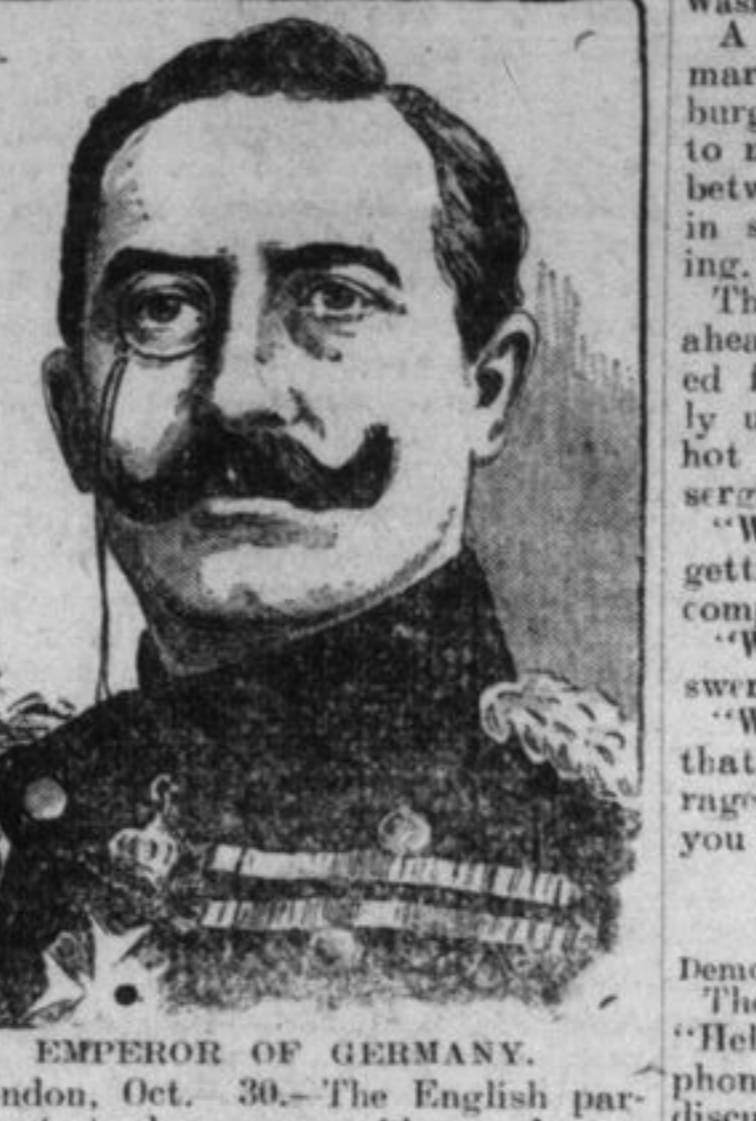

EMPEROR OF GERMANY.

London, Oct. 30.—The English parliament, today, gave evidence of going to the bottom of Emperor William's charge that he furnished the war office with military plans for the prosecution of the Boer war, similar to those eventually adopted by Lord Roberts.

Honey In Texas.

Texas also stands first in the number of colonies of bees, the number being 417,000. The honey crop of Texas brings an annual revenue of approximately \$600,000, the price for which it sells ranging from eight to ten cents a pound.

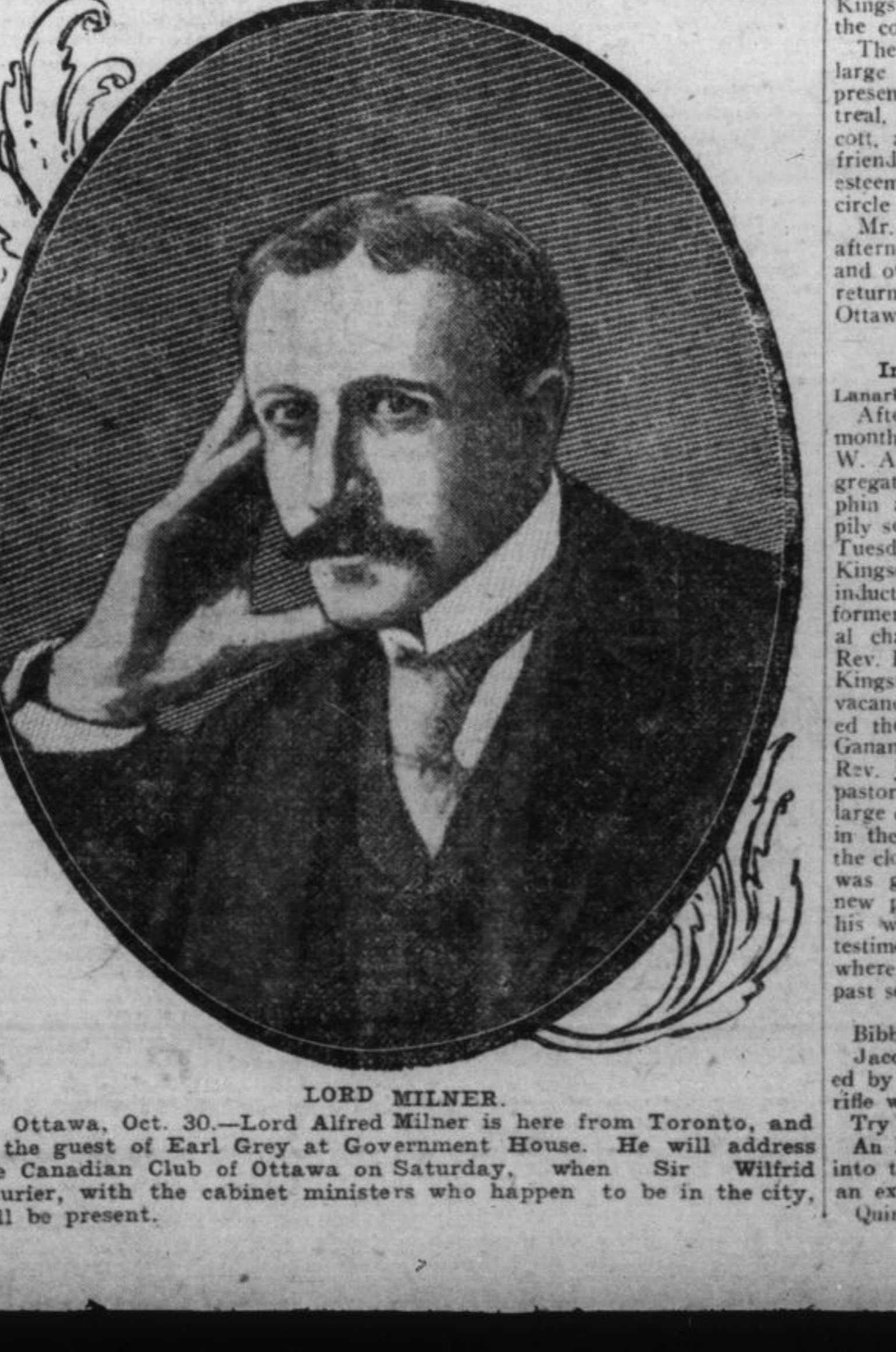
