SIGNS OF SUCCESS

Republicans Predict Increased Control in Congress.

Hughes to Win by 75,000 and State to Be Carried by Taft by 120,000.

New York, Oct. 31.—Representative Henry C. Loudenslager, of New Jersey, secretary of the republican national congressional committee, gave out his estimates of the complexion of the national house of representatives in the sixty-first congress.

"I am confident," he added, "that election results will give an increase in the number of republicans rather than a decrease."

Chairman Hitchcock, of the republican national committee, said that he was still of the opinion that Nevada would be close, but he is quite confident of Montana for the republican party.

Secretary Straus, of the department of commerce and labor: "Judge Taft will carry the state of New York by a majority ranging between that received by Roosevelt in 1904 and McKinley in 1900."

General Streeter, of New Hampshire: "Taft and Sherman will come out about 15,000 ahead in my state."

Senator Lodge, of Massachusetts: "New England will give its entire electoral vote for Taft and Sherman."

Former Governor Murphy, of New Jersey: "It is a question of majority only for Taft and Sherman in New Jersey."

Here W. H. Taft is portrayed in the characteristic attitude while in the act of delivering a speech from the rear of the special train which he made a tour of the doubtful states.
