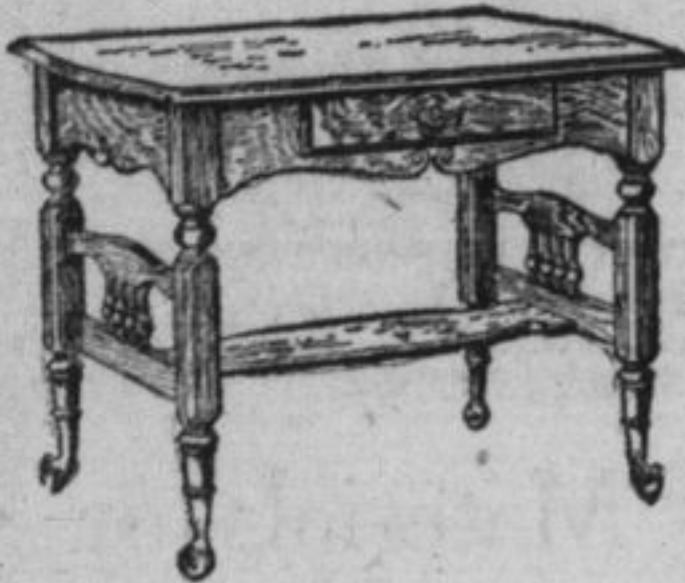

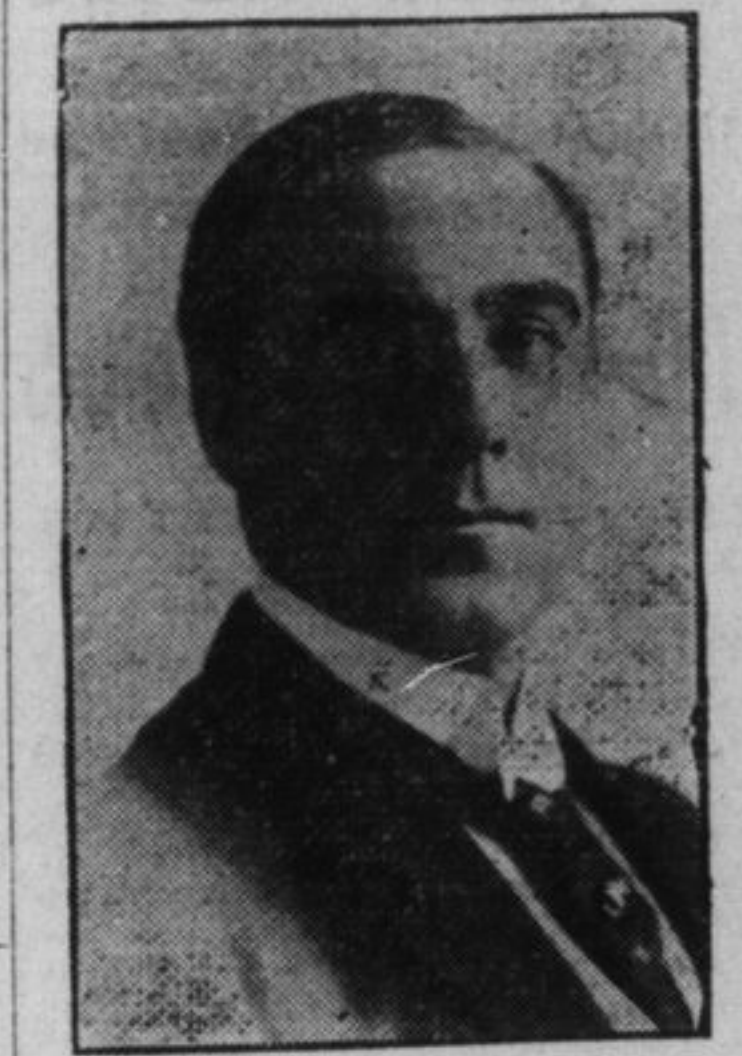
Mr. Gabelein Talked Upon "God's Masterpiece" As Unfolded in the Ephesians—A Wonderful Doxology.

Swift's Steamer Aletha from bay points. The steamer Navajo carried a cargo of lumber from Quebec, to Oswego.

The steamer Wassaga cleared for Belleville, to load cement at the cement works, for Fort William.

The steamer Glendora from Prescott, discharged 1,400 bushels of damaged grain, at Richardson's elevator.

At M. T. Co's. elevator: The steamer Donnacona, arrived from Fort William with 89,000 bushels of wheat; the steamer Glenmont arrived from Fort William with 102,000 bushels of wheat, barley and wheat; the tug Thompson arrived from Montreal, with three light barges, and cleared for that port, with three grain-laden barges.

The steamers Donnacona and Glenmont will clear for Fort William to-day.
