DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or la certain districts a homesteader in

good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fift acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased comestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even numbered Sections South of township 45. East of the Cal-gary and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 26, and West of the third Meridian and the Sault Railway line.
