Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section (100 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

THE HALLS OF QUEEN'S TRYING TO AWAKEN THE ARTS SOCIETY.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier will be invited to give an address at the First Dinner of the Arts Society. Queen's University Historical Society are to have a rare treat on Friday evening when Professor Wrong, of Toronto University, will give a lecture on "The Making of History."

The regular meeting of the Arts Society was held on Tuesday afternoon. The retiring president was in the chair and only about thirty members were present—a circumstance much to be regretted. The secretary read the results of the recent elections and the members of the Historical Society to attend.

A committee was then appointed to enquire into the way and means of holding a definite art festival. The committee consisted of the following: President Donnell, (convener) P. L. Jull, H. (secretary), A. G. Dorland, G. L. Fraser, J. W. North, J. D. Ramsay, M.A., divinity. The above committee has met and hope that the arts society will come out of its shell.

AN UNPRECEDENTED EVENT Was the Semi-Jubilee of Rev. Dr. Barclay in Montreal.

The proceedings in St. Paul's church, Montreal, on Thanksgiving day, were of an unprecedented character, and the subject of celebration, Rev. Dr. Barclay, the minister well known in Kingston from his frequent visits to Queen's convocations and the meetings of the board of trustees, was the centre of attraction of an enormous gathering. The richest and the poorest, and ministers of all sections of the church were present to hear testimony to his sterling worth and to honor him on the completion of his semi-jubilee as pastor of St. Paul's. Before the proceedings in St. Paul's church, Montreal, on Thanksgiving day, were of an unprecedented character, and the subject of celebration, Rev. Dr. Barclay, the minister well known in Kingston from his frequent visits to Queen's convocations and the meetings of the board of trustees, was the centre of attraction of an enormous gathering.

ceedings were over it could be safely said that they were without a parallel in church history. After an eulogy by the chairman, an exquisitely illuminated address, a veritable work of art and handsomely framed, was unveiled and presented to him. Then a lady in the name of the ladies made a touchingly eloquent address and presented Dr. Barclay with handsome pulpit-ropes and university hoods, M.A., D.D., and L.L.D. They likewise presented Mrs. Barclay with a purse containing \$500. Then in the name of the whole congregation, the oldest elder presented Dr. Barclay with a purse containing \$5,000. But the enthusiasm of the gathering had not reached its height until one of the trustees of the church made the announcement that Lord Mountstephen, long connected with St. Paul's, and still a supporter though resident in England, had transferred securities to the present value of nearly \$80,000 as a personal gift to Dr. Barclay and a token of his admiration. The securities were presented to Dr. Barclay with an applause that seemed to indicate that the congregation was bewildered. Then speeches followed by nearly two dozen clergymen. Dr. Symonds of Christ church cathedral was ready to offer Dr. Barclay the bishopric of Montreal, declaring that he had only to say he was willing to find the invitation of both clergy and lay unanimous. The Rev. Dr. Mackie, of Kingston, who with Mrs. Mackie, are Rev. Dr. Barclay's oldest friends, had a four pervading joy, lest the marvelous conduct of the congregation had moved Dr. Barclay a little off that line of direct apostolic succession, which the Scottish church had always so secretly guarded as the pathway of her clergy.
