



COALS OF ALBERTA IN GREAT DEMAND FOR RAILWAY PURPOSES.

U. S. Railways West of Rockies Dependent on the Alberta Coal Fields—Bituminous Coal Beds Very Valuable.

It is not generally known by the public that the area of bituminous coal in Western Canada is practically limited to the Crow's Nest district in Southern Alberta and the Peace River district in Northern British Columbia. There are enormous deposits of lignitic coals in Alberta, Manitoba and Saskatchewan, but the lignitic coals are unfit for railway purposes for the reason that they produce cinders which cause prairie and forest fires, and consequently, involve the railways in heavy damages. It is a well-known fact that the C.P.R. were importing bituminous coals from Kentucky and Ohio for use during the dry seasons before the Crow's Nest company's mines were opened up. These bituminous coal fields are an invaluable treasure house to the far west of Canada and should be carefully husbanded for in the years to come they will be more highly prized than even they are now. It is only comparatively a few years ago that similar coal lands in Ohio could be bought for from \$2 to \$2.50 per acre that are now worth from \$2,000 to \$2,500 per acre. The latest big colliery to be opened in the bituminous field of Alberta is the Western Oil & Coal Consolidated's new colliery at Beaver Creek, known as the Beaver Cokes. Recent reports state that these collieries have over seventy million tons of coal in sight. This seems enormous, but when one remembers that there is now 10,000 tons of coal per day going out of the collieries in the Crow's Nest district, and that all the collieries are working double time, and have their output sold over a year ahead, it does not mean so much. Twenty-five years at 10,000 tons per day would exhaust even this latest big colliery. The coal lands of the Canadian North-West are being preyed upon, and the opportunities for securing bituminous coal lands are getting very rare.

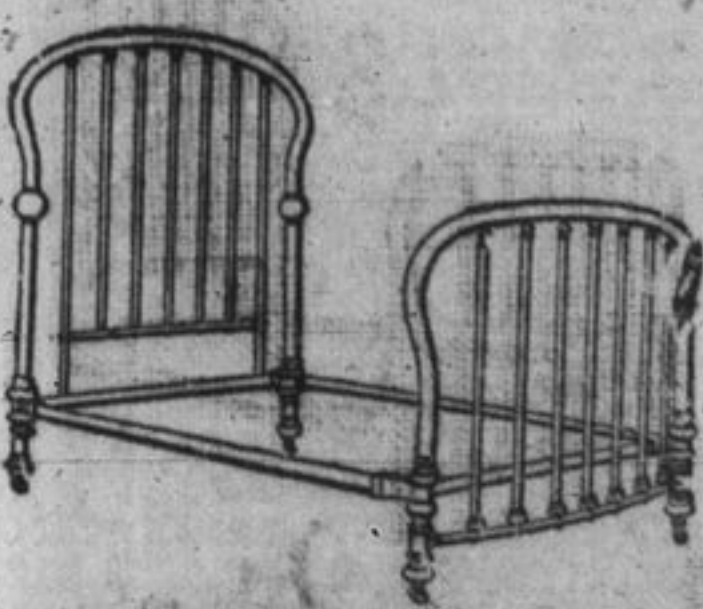

THE THIRD ATTEMPT

ISSUE TEXT OF THE EDUCATION BILL. Now Act of British Government is in Nature of Compromise and Will Be Opposed By Extremists.

London, Nov. 27.—The government has issued the text of their third attempt to draw up an education bill, which will draw through parliament all parties to get through parliament. It is in the nature of a compromise, and will undoubtedly meet strenuous objection on the part of all extremists. All schools receiving local aid pass under the control of the school board authority. No teacher employed or seeking employment, is required to subscribe to any specified religious denomination or attendance, or abstain from attending any place of religious worship or give any religious instruction.

These provisions, the government maintains, will provide one type of school throughout the country, the whole apparatus of managers appointed to guard the interests of a particular denomination, passing away. This makes a great distinction from the old bill, which involved a conflict by the church, in compensation for which, she gets "the right of entry." This takes the form of a provision that if any parent desires it, denominational religious instruction may be given to his children, a week between 9 and 9:45 o'clock. It is provided that the denomination concerned shall defray the expenses. Forty-five minutes a day of undenominational religious teaching. The bill also provides for contracting out of schools committed to denominational teaching, as, for instance, the Roman Catholics. They will get a parliamentary grant provided they fulfil certain conditions, but they will receive no rate aid.

Women of To-Day. At a "coming out" ball in a metropolitan city a few years ago the debutante and her grandmother both danced in the cotillon. They were both slender and graceful, both beautiful dancers. To the casual observer they differed in these respects: The debutante had auburn hair, the unlined face of the "undead girl" and talked haltingly. The grandmother had white hair, a wrinkled face and talked fluently. That she should both be dancing aroused no particular comment. To-day numerous American women play tennis until forty years of age and quiet games until sixty. Not long ago a New York society woman who is close upon forty was told by her physician that she must not hereafter walk over twenty miles in a day. Plenty of English sportswomen "follow the hounds" until past fifty years of age.

Peanuts. Peanuts only thrive in a warm climate. The plant requires a firm, sandy loam and yields from two bushels of pods planted an acre as much as forty or fifty bushels of pods and two tons of straw. The crop is harvested before frost in the fall, the plant being loosened by means of a special plow, then taken up and put into shocks. After drying from fifteen to twenty days the pods are picked.

Mister Aad Master. Formerly the term "master" was a markedly respectful form of address. Now in the form "mister" it has become common property, while "master" itself has become confined to boys. However, the fall of "master" has not been so great as that of the French "monsieur." At one time even a saint was spoken of as "Monsieur St. Jean." Under the early Valois the king was "monsieur" in public documents, and later it became the title of the king's younger brother. Nowadays "M." is merely one level with "Mr."

The Bridge of Lions. A bridge comparatively little known was constructed long ago in China in the reign of the Emperor Keing Long. It is situated near to Sangang, and the Yellow sea and measures not less than eight miles and a half. The bridge of Lions, as it is called, is supported by 300 immense arches, and its foundation is twenty-one meters under water. On each pile of this wonderful bridge is a marble statue of a lion three times larger than life size. The couple of feet of these 300 enormous lions, each one supporting an arch, is stupendous in its magnificence.
