SYSTEM OF BRIBES

THIS IS WAY POLICE DEPARTMENT IS RUN.

So Says La Patrie of Montreal

—A Campaign is to Be Instituted Against the Pernicious System.

Montreal, Nov. 27.—It appears that Montreal is on the eve of a big house cleaning in the city hall and civic apartments. Following the revelations made by Ald. Robinson regarding the system of the purchasing department comes the announcement that a big campaign is to be instituted against alleged graft in the police department. This campaign is led by La Patrie, a French newspaper, which claims that the entire police force is run on a system of bribes and graft. A demand has been made for an investigation and sensational developments are looked for daily.

The discharge from the police department of Detective Guerin, one of the cleverest sleuths on the force on the ground that he made charges against Chief Campau and Ald. Proulx, chairman of the police committee during a speech he made in the recent election campaign, may prove the thin end of the wedge, which will pry open the door of the closet which contains the city hall skeleton. Detective Guerin has hinted that he can disclose some facts about the way in which the department is conducted and if he does as he threatens his statement may furnish the expected sensations.

It is alleged that a regular system of taxation on disorderly houses and illegal saloons is in force by which the police benefit, and there is a general demand from the citizens for a searching investigation.

FIRE ON STRIKERS.

First Hostilities in Vicinity of Perth Amboy.

Perth Amboy, N.J., Nov. 27.—The first hostilities between the striking operatives of the pottery works, in this vicinity, and the national guardsmen who are here to keep them in order, occurred last night, when a party of strikers advanced over the hills, from Kadesby, in the direction of the Standard plant, where the troops are encamped and on the way met an outpost of the second regiment. The guardsmen tried to halt the strikers, but the latter refused to obey the command and the guardsmen fired upon them. Twenty-five or thirty shots were exchanged, the striking Magyars and Poles using revolvers. The night being very dark the results of the encounter are not yet known, but the guardsmen say they saw the bodies of the strikers fall and that these four were carried away by their comrades.

Situation in New Brunswick.

In New Brunswick a curious condition exists as the result of the liberal sweep in that province. So sure were the local conservatives of winning, that two of them, Hon. D. Morrison and B. Frank Smith, resigned their seats in the local, but were defeated by Mr. Loggie and Mr. Carvell for the federal, and now there is a difficulty about getting back. There are a number of candidates for the provincial seats, and the liberals intend to make a vigorous fight to reclaim them, it is a question whether these two gentlemen have not bid farewell to public life, for a time at least. New Brunswick, which was regarded by the conservatives as solid for their party, furnished one of the surprises of the campaign, and it would be less surprising in the provincial contest, to see the seats referred to return to their liberal allegiance.
