FOUND THE ORIGIN OF RUMOR ABOUT CATTLE BEING INFECTED.

A Strict Quarantine Kept on All Cattle From the United States—Think the Man Worked a Swindle.

Windsor, Ont., Dec. 2.—The government inspectors at work in Essex county have discovered the origin of the rumor that Canadian cattle are infected with foot and mouth disease. In Rochester township several herds of cattle were found with black leg, a contagious but not infectious disease. Calves are the most susceptible to this disease which usually proves fatal. The strictest kind of a quarantine is still being kept on anything from the states that might possibly carry the malady into Canada and the orders now in effect bar even automobiles from across the border. The government inspection of Essex county cattle will be continued under E. W. W. Stork, Toronto, but it is not believed any foot and mouth disease will be found. A man of smooth tongue, suave manners and fine appearance visited F. H. Laing, druggist, some time ago presenting a card that bore the name of Paul De Buskers, and requested the bearer to be a salesman for a drug concern in Montreal. Mr. Laing gave an order and paid for it and a Windsor publisher printed considerable advertising but now repeated efforts to communicate with the Montreal office of the concern have failed and the man is believed to be a swindler in consequence.

RUMORS OF PROTESTS.

Story That Both Sides Will Enter Them.

Montreal, Dec. 2.—From conservative quarters a story is issued to the effect that the liberals are contesting the eleven counties won by the opposition at the federal election, and that the conservatives are entering protests against the return of thirty-three liberal members in the province of Quebec. They also declare that, by Saturday evening, thirty-four out of the thirty-seven counties won by the liberals in Ontario will be protested. It is also alleged that Sir Wilfrid Laurier's seat will be among the contested ones, and that his disqualification may be sought for on an alleged letter written to Mr. McGeivern, assuring him of a general increase in salaries in the civil service.

Lecturing in Prince Edward.

Pictou, Dec. 2.—Messrs. E. M. Young and M. R. Allison were in Toronto, the latter part of last week, in connection with the application for manumission to local option. Albert Powers has moved into his new store. The work on the new high school is progressing favorably. Miss C. Fox, B. A., senior teacher, Consec, visited her home on Saturday. John R. Clark, king of the lecture platform, is visiting the country and delivering lectures at various places.

Not Seriously Hurt.

Port Colborne, Ont., Dec. 2.—W. J. Methers, a young machinist, of Peterboro, Ont., while working at the new government elevator, here, this morning, fell from a scaffold on the tower, a distance of twenty-five feet, landing on his feet. It is thought that with the exception of being badly strained, Mr. Methers will not suffer any serious injury because of the accident.

A Risk For Glenburnie.

Glenburnie, Dec. 1.—The farmers are finishing ploughing. The cheese factory has closed operations after a successful season. James Daly is steadily improving. K. Spooner has rented M. Shurtliff's place. School is progressing favorably under the management of the new teacher, Miss Blacklock. The hockey club met last week, and decided to construct a rink on Collie's Lake.

May Be A Saw-Off.

Berlin, Ont., Dec. 2.—An impression is abroad here that the conservatives will protest the election of Mackenzie King in North Waterloo, and also that the election of George Clary will be protested by the liberals in South Waterloo. The possibility of a saw-off is freely discussed.

Slightly Improved.

Simcoe, Ont., Dec. 2.—Police Constable Wilkins, who was shot, early yesterday, by Chief of Police Malone, passed a very restful night and his condition, this morning, is slightly improved.

KILLED BY A BLOW

Chain Struck Him During Storm on Lake Erie. Part Dover, Dec. 2.—The strong gale blowing on Lake Erie drove several steamers for shelter into Long Point Bay, yesterday. The Irish King steaming in toward the harbor, saw signals of distress. The tug Jim and Tom ran out to her and discovered that a seaman Albert W. Rose, who had shipped at Chicago, had been hit on the head by a chain during the storm, and had been unconscious from the time of the accident. Dr. E. S. Hicks went off on the tug and the injured sailor was brought ashore and taken to the hospital. Despite the efforts of the doctors, he died at 7 p. m., apparently as a result of a fracture of the skull.

A GREAT CARGO

Has Left Fort William For Buffalo. Fort William, Ont., Dec. 2.—The steamer Iroquois arrived yesterday, with both anchors gone. She reports forty-four ships are sheltered at Whitefish Point, near the Soo. No accidents are reported.

The record wheat cargo of the season was taken out, to-day, by the steamer Monahan, for Buffalo. It consisted of 421,000 bushels. This is said to be the largest cargo of grain taken across the great lakes.

The steamers William M. Mills and William B. Kerr, owned by the same Toronto interests that operate the Monahan, had a cargo carrying contest last year. The Mills succeeded in taking nearly 241,000 bushels down the lakes, while the Kerr moved 419,000 bushels.

Will Libel The Liner.

Montreal, Dec. 2.—As the outcome of the judgment of Commander Spain, censuring Capt. Dunlop, of the Allan liner Corinthian, for the collision with the "Main Head, near Quebec, the Allan liner will be at once libelled in the British courts. The repairs to the "Main Head, in a New York court, will approximate \$40,000 while the Corinthian's repairs will cost about \$27,000 with the lost time, legal expenses, etc. It is estimated that the total loss will be close to \$100,000.

A Dentist's Suicide.

New York, Dec. 2.—Dr. Rudolph Heas, a dentist, went out to Woodlawn cemetery, yesterday, and took his life on the grave of his wife. He had knelt down by the grave, when a special watchman saw him raise a bottle to his mouth, but the contents were swallowed and the doctor fell upon the grave in mortal agony before the watchman could reach his side. Death occurred before the arrival of an ambulance.

P. M. Bartlett's Resignation.

Windsor, Dec. 2.—Alexander Bartlett, who for the past thirty years has been Windsor's respected police magistrate, has forwarded his resignation to the government, to take effect at the end of the present month.

First In Canada.

London, Ont., Dec. 2.—The Lovejoy Plow company, of Cambridge, Mass., probably the largest makers of steel plows in the world, will open an agency in this city, the first in Canada, within a short time.

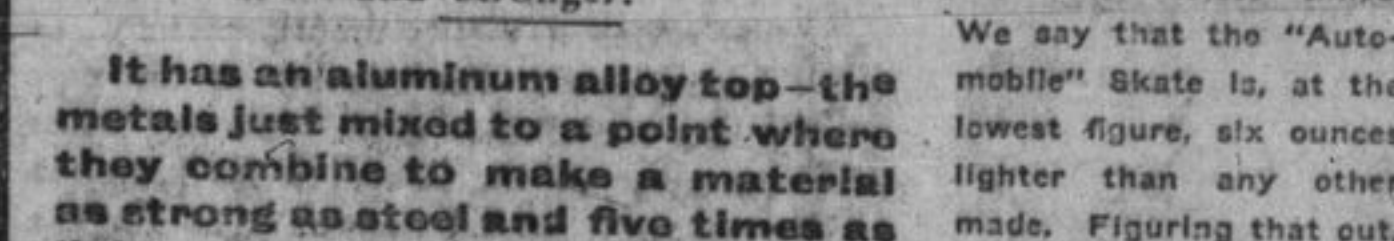
