

Juebec Bridge company have been notified that the government has resolved to exercise its power to take over the whole of the undertaking, assets, property and franchises of the company, pursuant to the provisions ament of Canada, 1908, and under the agreement executed between the government and the Quebec Bridge shareholders, who in cash and serallowed at the rate of five per cent. on the amount of the stock credited as being paid and a premium of ten per cent., the total payment by the government will be about \$355,000. 
