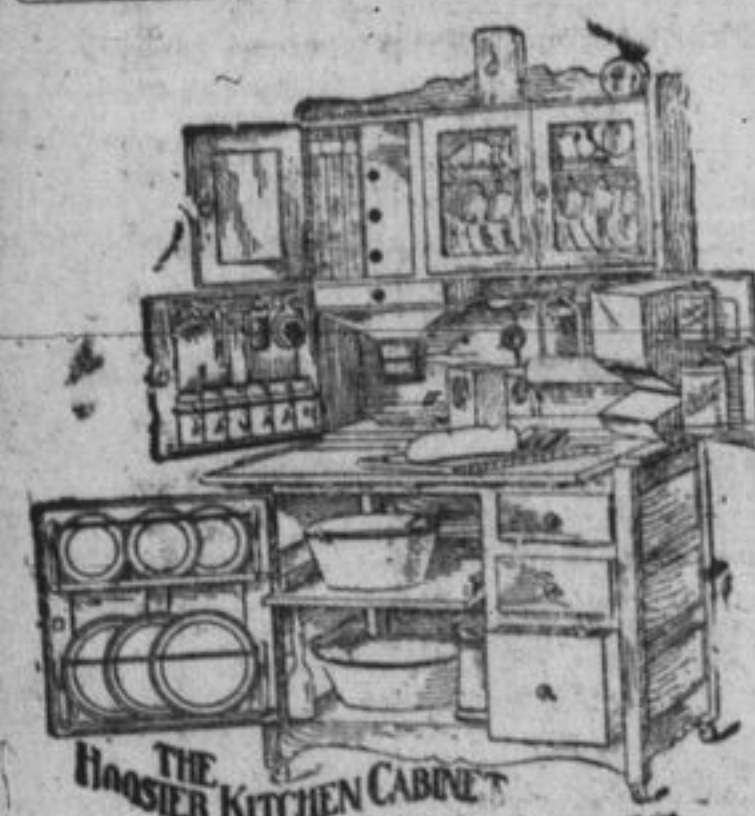

## NEWS OF THE WORLD

### OCCURRENCES RECOUNTED IN BRIEF FORM.

#### Matters That Interest Everybody

##### Notes From All Over—Little of Everything Easily Read and Remembered.

Rev. R. W. Dickie, B.A., pastor of St. Paul's church, Brandon, has accepted the call to Crescent street church, Montreal.

Fire destroyed the chair factory of Knauas Bros., and Arwine at Fayetteville, N.Y., with a loss of \$60,000, with small insurance.

The earnings of the Grand Trunk railway system for the week ended November 30th, shows a decrease of \$151,450.

Nine men, believed to be a gang of professional safe-crackers, in several cities of the western states and Canada, have been arrested, if Minneapolis.

Acting for Peter Christie, the conservative candidate, in South Ontario, James Baird, K.C., filed a petition against Frederick Luther Fowke, M.P., elect for South Ontario.

J. W. Webster, formerly of the Ontario game and fisheries department, is slated for Ottawa. He has been appointed chief clerk in the annuities branch of the federal government.

In Constantinople the Austrian boycott grows. Porters and lightermen are forced to take an oath not to work for Austrians, even if they are threatened with death for refusing.

Francis G. Palmieri, an Italian, has been arrested in New York, charged with using the mails to sell stock in a turbine company that promised to send ships from New York to Italy in two days.

In Illinois during the past year the divorces averaged one for every twelve marriages. In Peoria county, the centre of the whiskey interest, the proportion was one divorce to four and two-thirds marriages.

The Ontario Medical Council secured a conviction against Herbert M. Kipp, a druggist, of 168 McCaul street, Toronto, for a breach of the medical act in prescribing to two men sent by the council to collect evidence.

Efforts to divert the current of the Arkansas river from the gradually crumbling banks which border the business section of Pine Bluff, Arkansas, by dynamiting the levee on the opposite shore, have been successful, and it is now believed that danger of serious property loss, as was threatened, has passed.

## How An English M. P. Is Mulcted.

London Spectator. Of course the corrupt practices act has done much to prevent the spending of huge sums of money at the actual election. Expenses, then, are, we believe, effectually as well as nominally controlled. But if the "short sharp shock" of heavy disbursement at an election is a thing of the past, we understand that a new kind of disguised bribery has more than taken its place. The demands upon the pocket of every pliable member are unceasing. His annual subscriptions and donations amount to more, perhaps, than ever before. It has been said that in some cases it costs as much to bribe a constituency as to keep a steamyacht or a pack of hounds. But even if this is an exaggeration, it is, we are assured, by no means uncommon for constituencies to cost their member between \$10,000 and \$15,000 a year. In other words it used to cost a rich man \$50,000 down to get into parliament. Now it costs him \$6,000 at the election and \$10,000 a year for the five years which is the average duration of a parliament. Naturally we can hardly expect members of the house to tell us what they spend, but it is possible that some past members will be good enough to state in the public interest what amount they were compelled to spend each year in order to secure their seats.
