Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion
Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the
district. Entry by proxy may be made
at any agency, on certain conditions, by
father, mother, son, daughter, brother or
sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon
and cultivation of the land in each of
three years. A homesteader may live

three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or in certain-districts a homesteader good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties,—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fift- acres extra. nomestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may take a purchased bomestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homestead may be acquired on any available lands

WEST MINING REGULATIONS. COAL .- Coal mining rights may . b COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,560 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally,
100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00.

DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles. each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 24 per ent after the output exceeds \$10,000.
