MEXICO'S BURNING WELL. Town Miles Away Affected By the Fumes. Washington, Dec. 8.—Fumes so strong that all metals in a town sixty-five miles away are turning black, buzzards, parrots, and other birds are dying in great numbers, and the eye-sight of many people far away is affected, are announced as among the remarkable results of the great flow of the Mexican oil well at Dosohacs, Mex. Since the recent fire conflagration there, which, as published at the time, consumed several million barrels of oil during its almost two months' continuance, the best engineering skill on both sides of the Mexican-United States boundary line has been engaged in the effort to control the flow and conserve the oil.
