Sannatyne Defends Vaccination -Quotes Statistics to Show That it is a Preventive of

Kingston, Dec. 14-(To the Editor) In a paragraph of your paper of Tues-day, 8th December, it appeared as if the frumane Society inspector had been sent out to the Bath road on a wild goose chase, to investigate an alleged case of cruelty to cows by a Williamsville butcher. I took the trouble as a member of the K, H. S. to make enquiries and send you an account which I believe to be correct. The cattle had been pasturing in the same field having been grazed over all the summer by other cattle and heep. A Defence Of Vaccination.

Kingston, Dec. 15-(To the Editor) I have read with much interest the letter of Anti-Compulsion, in your issue of Thursday. He seems to be much troubled about the legality of vaccination, but he does not seem to wish his name to be known, as a man would if he was sure of his argument on this subject. Leaving all this argument about vaccine, and where it is produced let us go to the results of inoculation or vaccination, as I suppose this will be more to the point at this time.

As appears from the researches of eminent writers, this disease, as also measles, had prevailed in China and Hindustan, from remote history, and had not extended to the more western nations till the sixth century. About this period these maladies reached the southern coasts of Arabia by vessels trading with India and broke out near Mecca, during the war of the Elephant in the year 569, immediately before the birth of Mahomet. During the later part of the sixth, and the whole of the seventh century, they were spread by the Arabians over the remaining countries of Asia. In the eighth century, Europe Girl. was contaminated in consequence of the Saracens invading Spain, Sicily, Italy and France. They reached Saxony, Switzerland and England in the ninth and tenth century, and lastly in the beginning of the sixteenth century, twelve years after the death of Columbus. The nfections were transported by the Spaniards to Hispanala and soon after to Mexico, and in every country where it was introduced it caused fearful destruc-

Where the practice of inoculation originated is involved in obscurity. Some letters of Dr. Williamson, Mr. Owen, and Mr. Wright in the hilosophical transactions for the year-1722, assert that inoculation was wellknown in the South of Wales and in the Highlands of Scotland, before it was practised in England. It was introduced into England from Turkey, by Lady Maraj Warthly Montague, about the year 1721, whose son was inoculated in Constantinople during her residence there, and whose daughter was the first person inoculated in England. Next was the daughter of Dr. Keith who had visited Miss Warthly Montague. After this six criminals who were pardoned on condition of submitting to the experience, (and who all recovered) in

the year 1726, were inoculated. Dr. Marsden who has been the resi dent of the London Smallpox and Vaccination Hospital, says that smallpox is a most fatal disease in all periods of life, the least so, from 10 to 15 years exceeds the mortality of infancy; and after 60 hardly any one escapes.

Mr. Marsden has always made it an imperative rule that new nurses and other attendants of the hospital should be vaccinated. In their case it is gen-erally re-vaccination and is never repeated. The nurses live in closest daily and nightly attendance on smallpox patients, yet in no instance for thirty-four years has any of them taken smallpox. In the British army every recruit is closely examined and if he has not been formerly vaccinated or had smallpox, he is vac-
