

The question of the advisability of leasing the government dry dock to company that will establish a first class repair shop in connection with it, again discussed in marine circles. Some time ago, the Collingwood Shipbuilding Co., which operates a dock at Collingwood and receives a fat government bonus for so doing, made advances to secure the lease of the Kingston dock, to operate it in conjunction with a local company. QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00.
