BOSTON'S BARBER REGULATIONS.

Board of Health Orders Sterilization of All That Barbers Use on Customers.

A special despatch from Boston, May 5th, 1900, to the New York Sun, gives new regulations of the Boston Board of Health as to barber shops.

"Mucous, shaving brushes and razors shall be sterilized after each separate use thereof. A separate, clean towel shall be used for each person. Material to stop the flow of blood shall be used only in powdered form, and applied on a towel. Powderuffs are prohibited."
