

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations. ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quartersection (160 acres, more available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES .- Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years, A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.-Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fift- acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased comestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even numbered Sections South of township 45, East of the Calgary and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 26, and West of the third Meridian and the Sault Railway line. Duties .- Must reside six months in

each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect - house worth \$300. SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS. COAL .- Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at-an annua. rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,560 acres can be leased to one appli cant. Royalty, five cents per ton. QUARTZ.-A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder.
