

Board Of Works. This was the busiest committee of the council, and this year it was especially busy, as early in the year it had to deal with the snow-cleaning question, in order to keep the railway open. This cost \$1,500. During the year over six and a half miles of concrete waiks were laid, besides many asphalt crossings. A mile and a half of macadam road was constructed. which cost \$250 more than provided by the by-law. The permanent road building scheme was considered for several months. The result of the committee's recommendation over two weeks ago is well known, and this permanent road pavement will not likely be begun next year. One thing standing to the credit of the board of works this year is the completion of the O'Kill street sewer extension. 
