Land Regulations. ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE bead of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, askatchewan or Alberta. The applicamust appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of ***************

> farm of at least 80 acres solely owned In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quartersection along-side his homestead. Price \$3:00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fift- acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads South of township 45, East of the Cal-

line. Duties .- Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,560 acres can be leased to one appli cant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.
