## THE CRIB ON FIRE

### AND MANY WORKMEN PLUNGED INTO LAKE.

And Some of Them Are Said to Be Drowned—An Awful Alternative, Burn or Drown.

Chicago, Jan. 20.—Seventy-five men, employed on a crib several miles out in Lake Michigan, jumped into the lake, this morning, when the crib was destroyed by fire. Telephone reports say several were drowned. When the fire broke out the men found themselves trapped, and had the alternative of burning to death or risking their lives in the water. The crib burned to the water's edge.

A lookout, on another crib, several miles away, phoned just before nine o'clock that he could see fifteen or twenty men clinging to the edge of the crib which was still aglow. A heavy sea is running and it is feared some of the men may be swept away.

### VOLCANOS BELCHING.

There is Trouble in Mexico and Philippines.

Mexico City, Jan. 20.—The volcano near the city of Colima is in eruption. It is throwing out a great quantity of ashes and pumice stone. Several slight earthquake shocks have been reported from that region, but no damage has been done. Predictions of more severe earthquake shocks are made by seismologists.

Volcano Very Active.

Manila, Jan. 20.—The volcano Taqanas, in the Tablas province, has exploded and become violently active. The eruptions seriously damaged the surrounding country. No report of loss of life has been received.

### Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fit acre extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either side or west of the Canadian Pacific Railway, or on the South of township 45, East of the Calgary and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 100, or on the third Meridian and the South Railway line. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at a rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per cubic yard.

QUARTZ.—Persons, eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$2.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.

PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00. miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 2 1/2 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000.
