

With bare feet and clad only in a shirt, tho first thought of the survivors was to fly, and they set off without thought

"There was a striking episode of collective mutism. Three hundred working people were about to enter a factory; they stayed outside and thus were saved, but their amazement was so great that when the director of the factory called their names scarcely one answered. Their names had slipped their recollection."
