Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE years old, may homestead a quartersection (160 acres, more or less) of
tvailable Dominion land in Manitoba,
saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant
must appear in person at the Dominion
tands Agency or Sub-Agency for the
fistrict. Entry by proxy may be made
at any agency on certain conditions, by
'ather, mother, son, daughter, brother or
sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon
and cultivation of the land in each of
hree years. A homesteader may live
within nine miles of his homestead on a
arm of at least 80 acres solely owned
and occupied by him or by his father,
mother, son, daughter, brother or
sister.
