AN ECHO FROM THE QUE BEC TER CENTENARY.

Men Told They Would Be Let Leave the Country If They Pleaded Guilty-They Did So. But Got Five Years Instead.

Quebec ter-centenary is an application to the department of justice for the release of Jacob Cohen and Abraham Glyck, both of New York, who were sentenced each to five years in the penitentiary for pocket-picking. The ground for the petition is that many arrests for this crime were made during the ter-centenary and those arrested, who were Americans, were allowed to go on condition that they at once left the country. When these two men were arrested, according to the petition, they were informed that if they pleaded guilty they would be treated as the others and allowed to go provided they left the country. In order to avoid the trouble of a trial they agreed to plead Dufferin Terrace, Quenec, during the celebration. They ask to be allowed to go on ticket of leave provided they agree to return to the United States
