A LENTEN MESSAGE

FLESH AND DEVIL RETARD CHRIST-LIKE GROWTH.

The first Lenten message of Bishop Farthing was read in all the Anglican churches throughout the diocese of Montreal, on Sunday. The message was as follows:

"This is an age of rush, and we have little time for prayer and meditation. Yet if we are to become like Him, we must find time. Our souls absolutely require this quiet, undisturbed time with God.
