Synopsis of Canadian Northwest

Land Regulations. ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quartersection (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned

and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3:00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even numbered Sections South of township 45, East of the Cal-gary and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 26, and West of the third Meridian and the Sault Railway line.
