Chong heard "hell of her predicament, and having previously seen her made the offer of marriage to a lawyer. The magistrate was glad to make the desired release, and the happy couple repaired to the restaurant after the ceremony.

### An Impartial Opinion.

Hamilton Herald.—The strong probability is that in withdrawing the Cobalt lake mineral rights from private exploitation and selling them for the benefit of the whole province the Whitney government did right. The strong probability is that the Florence Mining company had no just claim to the property. Still, we cannot but sympathize with the protest of Mr. Mackay against the action of the government in interposing to prevent a final decision in the case by the courts. If the Florence company's case was as weak as is claimed, surely the company would have failed to obtain a favorable decision, and if the government had not interfered and stopped litigation there would no be no excuse for accusing it of high-handed confiscation of private property.

### Again On The Up-Grade.

Toronto Star.—During the twelve months ending with December imports of merchandise into the United States aggregated \$1,115,000,000. This was \$308,000,000 less than for the calendar year of 1907. But, although the showing for the whole year is not a favorable one there is evidence that the turn in the tide has fairly set in, imports for the month of December being \$20,000,000 greater than for the same month of 1907. In the United States as in Canada business is again on the up-grade, given good crops for this year, 1909 will mark the beginning of another period of prosperity.

### As To Tubs.

Hamilton Spectator.—The idea that every tub should stand on its own bottom, as applied to civic departments, got a jolt in the city council Monday night. "Let the waterworks stand on their own bottom," was the argument of the waterworks committee. Let the city hall pay the proper water rates to the water department. Then one of the controllers remarked in effect, "Let the city hall stand on its own bottom. Let the waterworks pay the general tax to the city hall."

### The Age Of Brag.

Toronto News.—The Century Magazine says that the name and features of Theodore Roosevelt "are known to more persons throughout the world to-day, than those of any living person." It does not much matter whether this is true or not, but it illustrates the brag-habit of the people Mr. Roosevelt has been presiding over. The name and features of Edward VII are probably much more widely known than those of Mr. Roosevelt, and if the editor of the Century wants to make a bet with us on the subject all he needs do is to say so in his next month's issue.

### Tariff Revision.

Toronto Star.—Mr. Taft has declared himself strongly in favor of an immediate and radical revision of the tariff downward. He wishes the special session of congress which meets on March 15th, to do its work promptly, so that the changes in the schedule may come into operation on June 1st. In standing for immediate disposal of the problem, Mr. Taft displays economic foresight. Uncertainty as to what is to be done with the schedule is partly responsible for the slowness in trade recovery. The sooner the agony is over the better for industry in general.
