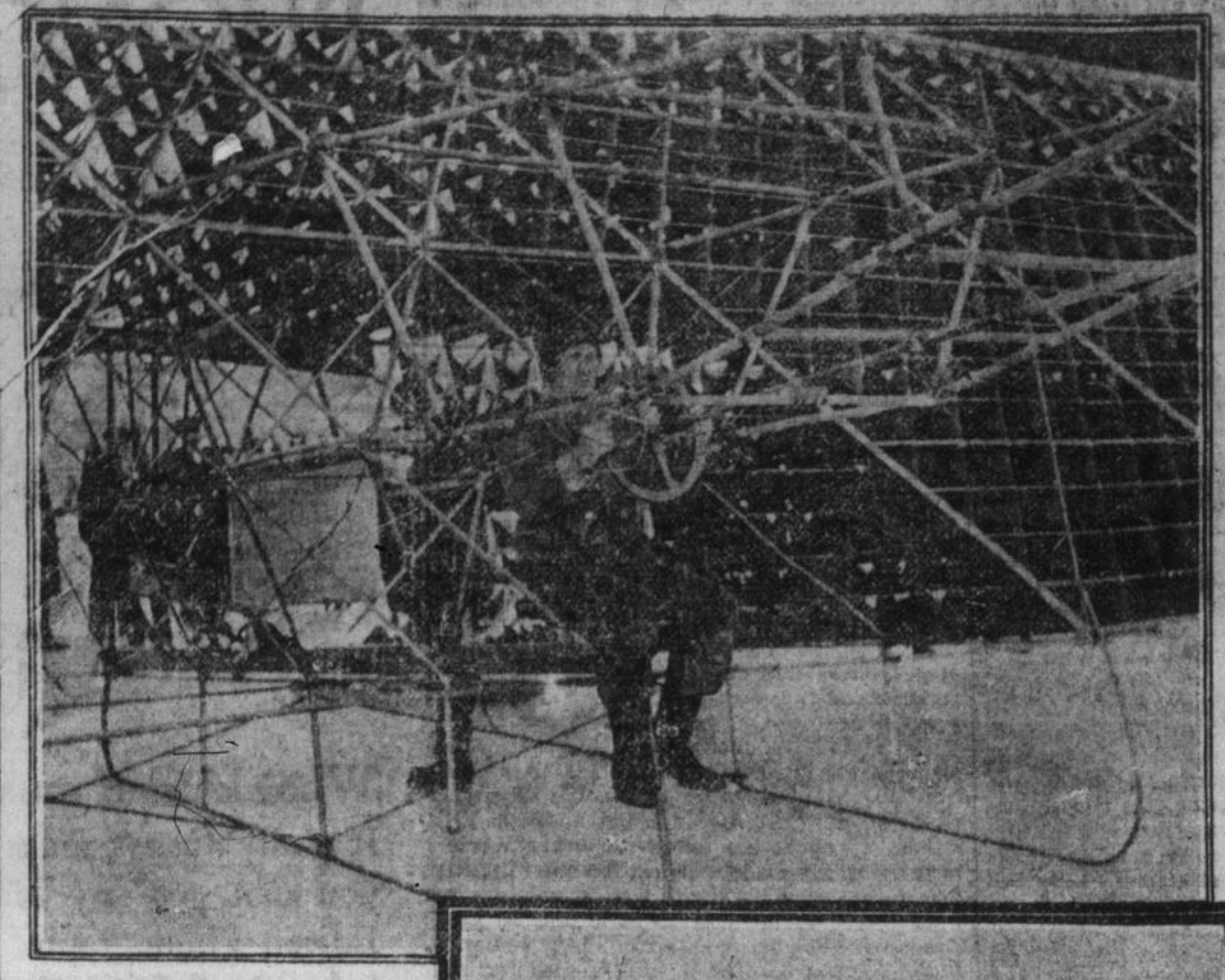

DR. GRAHAM AND HIS AERODROME.

Halifax, N. S., Feb. 27.—Since the successful flight of the Silver Dart, an aerodrome constructed by Douglas McCurdy, a young Canadian mechanical engineer, all Nova Scotia is interested in flying machines. The test of the aerodrome machine was made at Dr. Alexander Graham Bell's Nova Scotia home, Beinn Breagh, near Baddeck, and, after circling for a distance of four miles and a half, at an elevation of forty to fifty feet, the aerodrome landed on the ice of Baddeck Bay as easily and as gracefully as a bird.

Mr. McCurdy, who is just twenty years old, is one of the two engineers employed by Dr. Bell in the construction of his experimental flying machines. As a result of the experiments

with the Silver Dart, Red Wing, White Wing, June Bug and Signet, the machines built for Dr. Bell, the Aerial Experiment Association has been formed. Dr. Bell, Mr. McCurdy, G. H. Curtis, maker of motors, and two other engineers are the incorporators of the

association. Each of the five members built a flying machine after his own plan. The first flight was made by the ship Signet, a kite-like affair, which was built by Dr. Bell. The propeller of this machine snapped and the powerful engines were transferred to the Silver Dart.

IT SUPPORTS JACKSON

DICTIONARY SAYS GENESIS IS NOT SCIENTIFIC.

History Begins Chap. 12—Earlier Chapters Do Not Contain Literal Facts, But Are Mythological—The Flood.

In view of the intense interest that has been stirred up by the lecture of Rev. George Jackson, on "Genesis," it is interesting to note the latest word on "Genesis" as published in the new Standard Dictionary of the Bible, of which President R. A. Falconer and Prof. J. A. McCurdy, of Toronto University, are joint editors, together with thirty-seven other Biblical scholars.

This dictionary is just a month from the press, and it has been edited with a view to preserving the great fundamentals of the Christian faith. To quote the words of the editors:

"The critical position to which such a dictionary is necessarily committed must be one of acceptance of the proved facts of modern scholarship, of open-mindedness towards its still debated problems, and of conservatism of the fundamental truths of the Christianity proclaimed and established in the mission of Jesus Christ. The constituency to which the dictionary appeals is not to be helped by an apologetic method that ignores what a recent critical scholarship has brought to light regarding the Book of the Christian religion; nor is it to be served by a radical spirit, so enamored of novelty, and opposed to tradition, that it would seek to establish a new religion on the ruins of the historical facts of Christianity."

In this respect, the new dictionary may be said to be much more orthodox in its views than other recent publications, which are declared to be tainted with higher criticism. The viewpoint of the dictionary is substantially that outlined by Rev. Mr. Jackson in his lecture. The article is written by Prof. E. Nourse, D.D., of Hartford Theological Seminary, one of the three main editors. It reads:

istic conceptions. It was certainly no small matter that they were able to face that world and make use of many of its theories and yet triumph over its religious, spiritual, ethical, and monotheistic faith. It is just such a victory of Israel's religion that we find in Genesis, and of that victory the Book of Genesis itself is an incontestable witness. The book is everywhere instinct with this vital faith. Whether the writers are dealing with the ancient Babylonian cosmogony (as in chapter 1), or with the old legend of Jacob wrestling with the angel (the original significance of which must remain unknown), it is the same earnest religious feeling and purpose that are manifested. It is Israel's religion, the post-Mosaic religion of Israel, that we find in Genesis. And it is in what Genesis tells us, and seeks to teach of the character and progress of this religion in the ancient world that we are to find its highest value and may discern its inspiration."

The Creation Story. In an article on "Cosmogony," Rev. L. G. Leary, of Huguenot Memorial Church, New York: "The conceptions of Genesis 1 and 2 are not exactly those of modern astronomy, geology, or paleontology. The most obvious discrepancies are as follows: There is no reason for supposing that the Hebrew word 'yom' in Genesis 1 is used in any but its ordinary sense of a day of twenty-four hours. Plant life precedes sunlight, birds precede all land animals, and vegetation is complete in its highest forms before any animal life appears. Attempts to reconcile these statements with the teachings of modern science have been marked either by a dogmatic denial of scientific truths or by a distortion of the plain meaning of Hebrew and English words. To insist upon such a reconciliation shows a misconception of the character of divine revelation, and has put a stumbling block in the path of many an earnest, intelligent enquirer after Christian truth. The human and temporary framework of the creation story is so subordinate to its permanent, religious message that no advance in our scientific knowledge weakens our confidence in the great elemental truths concerning God, man, and the universe, which are so simply and so inimitably told in this fitting prelude to the story of redemption."

MAKING OF BOOTS.

Now Takes Just Four Minutes to Make a Pair.

But now, of course, shoes are made by machinery, and it is astonishing to hear how quickly they are made. It takes not four minutes to make a pair of boots! And the labor cost is about thirty-five cents. Of course no one makes the whole boot nowadays. There are a hundred different men making different parts of it. And each one does the same thing over and over again, and each man learns to do his particular work especially well and quickly. And you should see the buttons sewed on! A boy takes the part of the shoe where the buttons are to go and fits it into a machine, throws in a handful of buttons quite carelessly, turns the machine, and in no time out comes the piece of leather with all the buttons exactly in the right place. 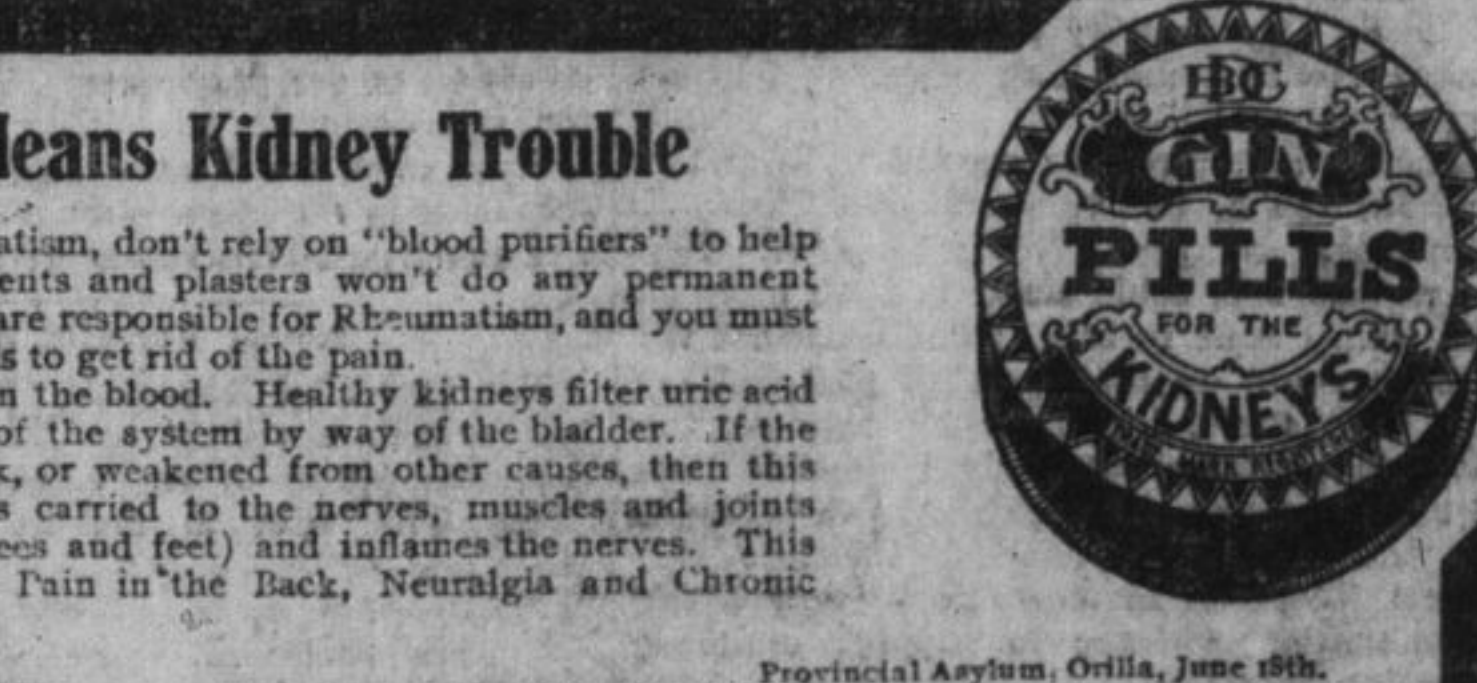
