The British Royal Commission The Poor Laws and Relief of tress, geter holding over two hun dred meetings in various parts of the United Kingdom, and gathering vol uminous evidence regarding the opera tions of the poor laws now in force have submitted the results of their investigations in a bulky report o ome twelve hundred pages. There was also a minority report of nearly half the size. But while there was biference in the details of the posed remedial measures to be adopted, they were unanimous in recommending the abolition of the board of guardians and the general workhouse. The council and borough councils are named instead to attend to the necessities of the pauper population, and instead of a general workhouse for all sorts of dilapidated humanity, there shall be separate institutions for the children, the aged and infirm, the able-bodied men, other able-bodied women, the vagrants, the dainty feeble-minded, the sick and the epileptics. Public assistance is recommend-




