EARL GREY TO ATTEND

THE QUEEN'S CLIFFSIDE HOCKEY MATCH,

And Will Face the Puck—Cliffside Realize That They Will have to Play Hard to Beat Queen's.

Ottawa, March 12.—Earl Grey informed the Cliffside officials and also telegraphed the trustees at Montreal that he would be pleased to attend Monday's match for the Allan cup between the Queen's university and Cliffside teams and that he would have much pleasure in facing the puck. Sir Montague Allan, donor of the new trophy, has wired up for a box, so the match will be witnessed by many distinguished spectators.

The Citizen says this morning: "Queen's septette are fast, experienced stick-handlers, several having played in the intercollegiate for two or three years. They are determined to lift the cup, and that the Cliffside will have to work their hardest to retain the trophy is a certainty. The Kingston people are greatly excited over the coming game for the Allan cup, and a big contingent of limestone city sports will come down with the students for the occasion, a special excursion train having been chartered to bring the hockeyists and their friends to Ottawa for the game and home again. The Queen's students will be represented in large numbers and, as usual, make the welkin ring with their joyous college songs and cheers. The Queen's team has been practicing steadily in preparation for their battle against Cliffside, and will be in great fettle by Monday."

The Cliffside will not be found off their guard, as the interprovincial champions regard the Queen's seven as an exceptionally dangerous one, and intend taking no chances. Cliffside have never played the Kingston students, but they have seen them in action and realize that in order to retain the cup they must work their hardest.

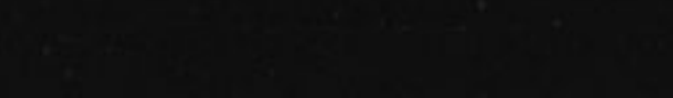
