MINISTER WAS "DONE" REV. JOHN O'NEILL MAKES A PECULIAR REPORT

To the Police of New York—Pistols Poked in His Ribs By Masked Men and Over \$800 Taken From Him.

New York, March 11.—Rev. John A. O'Neill, an English clergyman, on his way to Hamilton, Ont., to take a pastorate there, is satisfied the wild west isn't worse than New York.

According to one of his friends, the Rev. Mr. O'Neill arrived here last Saturday on the Lusitania, and went to the Grand Union hotel, intending to spend a few days seeing New York before continuing his journey.

The Rev. Mr. O'Neill is unsophisticated, according to his friends. Though fifty years old, he has spent most of his life in little English towns, where he had no opportunity to learn the devious ways which make Broadway at night what it is.

"Here he is," and a man wearing a black mask jumped in front of him, and, poking a revolver into his ribs said to the minister: "If you make a sound or move I'll kill you."

The minister's escort slipped a black mask over his face and ordered the clergyman to back up against the wall. Then the suave escort went through his pockets with astonishing speed.

In the clergyman's hip pocket he found a huge wallet, which contained the equivalent of \$800 in English sovereigns. How anybody could conveniently carry that much gold around with him the friend of the minister did not explain.

"Now we're going this way," said the amiable escort to the minister, pointing toward Sixth avenue, "and if you stir before we reach the corner we'll come back and blow your head off."

The minister stood motionless until the two men disappeared. Then he started for his hotel. On the way he met a policeman, to whom he told his story, but was advised to "run along."

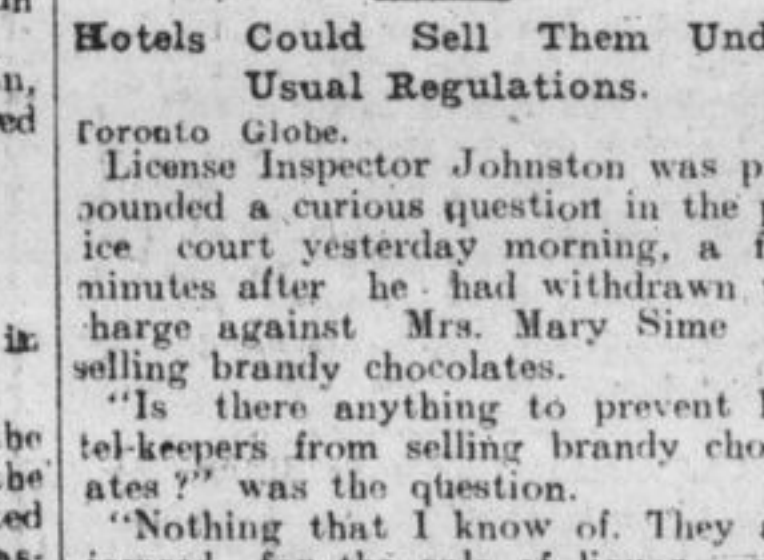

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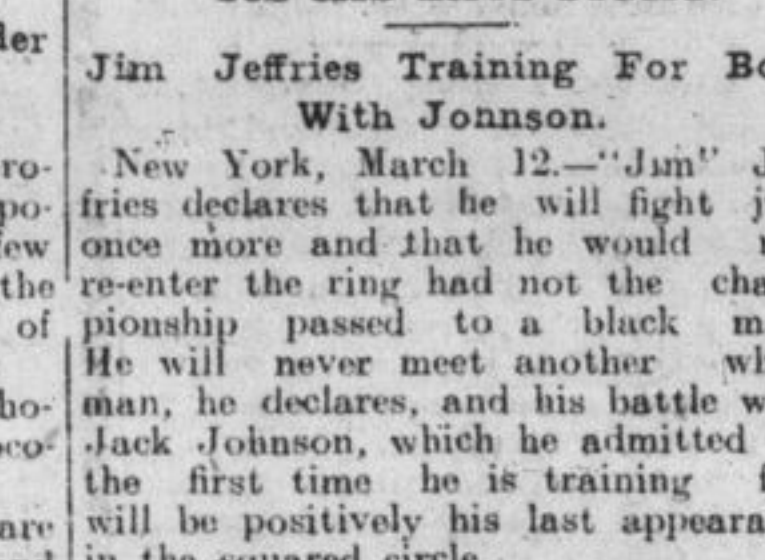
