Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, may, at any time, acquire a quarter-section (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

MEETING OF WOMAN'S NATIONAL COUNCIL.

To Be in Toronto in June—Delegates From All the World—Will Be Great Thing For Canada.

The drawing-room at the Y.W.C.A. was filled on Monday, with those anxious to hear Mrs. Willoughby Cummings, of Toronto, speak on the coming quinquennial meeting of the Woman's National Council.

Ms. Cummings emphasizes the importance, to Canada, of this gathering of women from Britain, from every country in Europe, from Argentina, and from the United States. If they are favorably impressed, their visit will do untold good to our great young country.

Some famous women will arrive in Quebec, June 11th, among them the only Swedish woman to be given a royal decoration, the wise woman who originated the council in 1897.

Splendid papers have come on ahead of their writers. One for author, the publisher of the big Danish training schools for servants. Herself a servant in earlier life, she knows the needs of both mistress and maid.

There will be men speakers at the meeting, the papers will be short, and instead of wordy resolutions of various sorts, the Kingston press will give a running up of the papers and subsequent discussion on each topic.

WHAT THE GOVERNMENT IS LIKELY TO DO.

Ontario's Proposed New Municipal Law—Would Refer Contracts With Public Utilities to Electors.

Toronto, Ont., March 16.—It is understood the Ontario government intends to introduce a bill, important and far-reaching in its effect, upon the present session of the legislature.

It is proposed also to repeal section 568 of the consolidated municipal act of 1903, which gives municipalities power to enter into agreements with private corporations for supply of water, gas, electric light, and power for a term not exceeding five years.
