THE SPORT REVIEW

ROYALS ARE CHAMPIONS OF THE K. A. H. A.

Defeated the Mic-Macs By 6 Goals to 5—Royals Led at Half Time By 5 to 1, But Mic-Macs Finished Strong.

Royals are champions of the Kingston amateur hockey association. They won the title at the Kingston skating rink on Monday night, when they defeated Mic-Macs 6 goals to 5, after an exceptionally hard game. The rink was well filled with people and the ice in fine condition for the championship games. Royals and Mic-Macs each lost one game during the season, hence the tie that was played off last night. Both teams played fast hockey and could give an O.H.A. intermediate team a good go.

In the first half the Royals started in very strong and when half time was called they led by five goals to one. The crowd were of the opinion that the Royals would be easy winners, but such was not the case. During the first period the Royals played fast, systematic hockey, and deserved every goal they secured. Their forwards played good combination and their defence worked like veterans. Ainslie opened the scoring for Royals after two minutes play. McCartney landed next, and then Singleton put in two. La Rush then opened up for the Mic-Macs, landing their only goal of this half. Just before half time was called Muckler netted the fifth for the Royals. The half was fast and in some places quite strenuous. Singleton and McCartney were retired for repairs.

In the second half Mic-Macs came back very strong and succeeded in finding Royals net four times while their opponents only landed once. As the score became closer the crowd became quite excited. Towards the end of the game the Mic-Macs put up a hard fight to even the score but could not succeed in getting another goal. The evil eye of "Bill" Kennedy, Dowsley, La Rush and Metcalfe did the scoring for the Mic-Macs in the second half, Dowsley landing twice. For the winners the stars were "Monty" Ainslie, McCartney and Kennedy and for the losers Nicholson, LaRush and Dick. The teams lined up as follows:

Royals (6)—Kennedy, goal; Cherry, point; H. Ainslie, cover; Singleton, rover; Muckler, centre; McCartney, left wing; M. Ainslie, right wing. Mic-Macs (5)—Sowards, goal; Evans, point; Dick, cover; Metcalfe, rover; Nicholson, centre; Dowsley, left wing; La Rush, right wing. Referee—"Senator" Powell. By winning this game the Royals become the first holders of the handsome trophy donated by James Sowards, the general proprietor of the Hall hotel, and president of the league.

Will Hold The Cup.

There will be no competition this year in the City Basketball League for the McFridgic cup held by St. James' club. This was decided at a meeting held last night in the Y.M.C.A. There was trouble in entering one of the local teams and after some discussion it was decided to allow St. James' club to hold the trophy for another year. Some good players are being developed in the various teams this year and some last years may be looked for next season.
