LATE EDWIN W. MAKIN

AN OLD RESIDENT OF KINGSTON TOWNSHIP.

Died at the Age of Eighty-One Years—Born in England, But Came Here When One Year of Age.

The late Edwin W. Makin, of Kingston township, was born in Coventry, England, in 1828, and came to Canada when only a year old and settled with his parents on a farm between Salisbury and Rattlesden. After a short school education he became interested in farming and engaged in the profession both in this country and in the United States side for a few years, prior to buying the farm he occupied for upwards of sixty years.

When he first settled on the farm the state, no roads and improvements as there are at the present day. The neighbors were also few and some distance apart. The farm upon which he lived was not much improved when it was purchased, but by steady hard work in a few years he had a larger part under cultivation, and also assisted in helping to clear other farms adjacent, and could tell many interesting tales in connection with cutting wood, logging, etc. The first year in farming, he decided to take to himself a helpmate and married Eliza Jane Hawkey, the only daughter of the late Robert and Jane Hawkey, who had shortly before come from Cornwall, England, and had settled a short distance away from his home. The result of the marriage was eight of a family, four boys and four girls, of whom seven are living: Edwin, at Moscow; Mrs. R. Flindall, Lovett; Mrs. Joseph Vanness, Gladwin, Mich.; Mrs. J. W. Baker, Millhaven; Thomas, at Ida Hill; Samuel on the homestead, and William near Lombard.

In religion deceased was a Methodist and an active church-worker for over forty years, holding the position of Sabbath school superintendent, class-leader and conductor of prayer meetings in the village school house for many years, and in early life his house was thrown open for preaching for a number of years prior to the formation of a church society in the locality. For the cause of temperance he was one of the strongest workers county ever produced and advocated its principles on every occasion he had the privilege to do so. After farming a few years he was in a position to erect a barn and when asking for assistance to erect the same he received a reply from a number that if he did not have liquor there they would not come to the building work. Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy is not made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon the land, and the homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader of good standing may pre-empt a quarter section, alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to clear homestead) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even numbered sections South of township 45, East of the Calgary and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 29, and West of the third Meridian and the West of the Railway line. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over may make a discovery therefor to locate a claim for gold, silver, iron, lead, copper, zinc, etc. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with, the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre.

BLASTER MINING CLAIMS. generally 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$2.00.

DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 25 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000.
