Wounded Man's Trying Time. London, March 27.—For three hours yesterday Hill, a young man, living in this city, lay alone in the woods ten miles from here, with a rifle bullet in his leg, causing him intense pain.

Smallpox On A Steamer. Philadelphia, Pa., March 27.—Fifteen physicians of the bureau of health of Philadelphia left here, yesterday, for Marcus Hook, Pa., south of here, where they will assist the three-state quarantine physicians in vaccinating everyone on board the American line steamship Merion from Liverpool, which is held up at the state quarantine station because two passengers in the steerage were found to be suffering from small-pox. All told, 630 persons will be compelled to submit to the physicians' needle.

Price Of Coal. New York, March 27.—There was no reduction in the price of coal here, yesterday, the meeting of the Coal Merchants' Association, which had been called to declare the usual spring reduction, being postponed, as the expected notification of a reduction in the wholesale price by the operators was not received.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations. ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age may homestead a quarter-section (160 acres, more or less) of unalienated Dominion and in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader to good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate five acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either side or even numbered Sections South of township 45 East of the Can. Ry. and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 96, and West of the third Meridian and the South Railway line. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.

WEST MINING REGULATIONS. COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton. QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate claims 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre. DREDGING.—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 25 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000. W. W.
