London, March 29.—Few would be so bold as to dispute the assertion that the most tragic and terrible event of recent years has been the wholesale massacre of Jews in Russia. But so fleeting is the memory of mankind that scarce any remembrance remains of those barbarous misdeeds. Their effects, however, remain. Such was the reflection forced upon me in conversation that I held with H. Reuben Brainin, the distinguished Hebrew writer. He has recently returned from a lecturing tour through the Pale of settlement, in which he had exceptional opportunities of studying the social conditions of Jewish life and the changes that have been wrought by the pogroms.

But after a few minutes we became friends. 'And the spiritual conditions?' I inquired. 'What can you expect? There is spiritual anarchy. Despair and depression are everywhere. Once there was hope that salvation was near, and prayers were offered daily to bring it more speedily. But now there seems to be no hope, and the people have lost faith. The number of those who have forsaken Judaism and become baptized, especially in Southern Russia, is really appalling. 'Doctors, dentists, lawyers, all sorts of university men have abandoned the faith of their fathers, not out of conviction, but simply out of despair. APPEAL TO GOVERNOR CITIZENS SEEK PARDON FOR EDWARD WITHERS.

Petition in Behalf of Man Sentenced to Prison Signed By City and County Officials—Judge Makes Personal Plea.

Ogdensburg, N.Y., March 30.—An imposing petition will be sent to Governor Hughes asking for executive clemency in the matter of Edward Withers, of this city, who was sentenced to one year in Dannemora prison for alleged misappropriation of funds. The names of the mayor and aldermen, practically every influential citizen of Ogdensburg and of all county officials are attached to this request for pardon or suspended sentence. In addition, Judge Paddock, of Malone, who sentenced Withers, and District Attorney Crapser, of Massena, who prosecuted the case, have written personal letters to the governor, stating that, in their opinion, the crime was one of error or ignorance, and not of intent. Mr. Withers emphatically claims that he did not take one cent of money from the Chicago packing firm, which he represented in Northern New York.

Manitoba Suffers Mismanagement. Winnipeg Free Press.

The question of an extension of the boundaries of this province is an important one. Coupled with it, is the question of an increase of subsidy. The federal government has proposed an extension of boundaries which the provincial ministers have substantially admitted to be satisfactory. On the question of increased subsidy, the provincial ministers claimed that the subsidy should be readjusted in accordance with the terms given to Alberta and Saskatchewan. In 1906 Mr. Roblin and Mr. Campbell, representing the province of Manitoba, went into the interprovincial conference and expressly bound the province of Manitoba to an arrangement then made and accepted as satisfactory. By so doing, they absolutely and completely closed their own mouths, and stopped themselves from bringing in the Alberta and Saskatchewan precedent.

That was a good precedent for Manitoba, but the time to raise it was when the interprovincial conference was being held. Having failed to raise it, and having agreed to another arrangement, the Manitoba ministers now appear in a ridiculous light in trying to "bluff" out of the effects of their blunder. The best of friends can hardly help, where a case is so stupidly mismanaged.

Harry Furness relates in Strand Magazine a story which is better than any sermon on the foolishness of being impolite. A rich member of the aristocracy, without heirs or relatives had taken a fancy to an acquaintance, and in time accepted him as guide, philosopher and friend. USE THE WHOLE TREE.

Plan to Prevent Waste in Manufacture of Pulp.

Minneapolis, Minn., March 29.—A method which will prevent the waste of the pulp in the manufacture of paper, and which it is claimed that the United States will produce a hundred times as much wood pulp paper as was believed possible, is causing interested discussion here. It is claimed that the discovery means that every cord of fir timber will yield a considerable sum on by-products alone, and that most of the sixty per cent of a tree now wasted will be utilized. Dr. Frankforter says he has experimented for twelve years. He describes the perfected process as placing small pieces of waste wood or sawdust on a steel incline over a furnace and forcing distillation of the waste wood by saturating it with carbon disulphide or gasoline, thus causing the turpentine and resin to pass off as gases and leaving wood pulp free from pitch and perfectly adapted to the manufacture of paper. The common method of distillation leaves the pulp in the form of charcoal, chemically of little value. Dr. Frankforter extracted from one cord of Norway pine worth \$7.50 turpentine worth \$41 and wood pulp worth \$39, a yield of \$80 from \$7.50 worth of raw material.

BISHOP OF LIVERPOOL.

Pleads For Natural Use of Voice in Public Service.

London, March 30.—The Bishop of Liverpool makes a strong plea for the natural use of the voice in public service. He says he is tired of the droning of ecclesiastical services in high churches. 'Why,' asks the bishop, 'should a man, a strong and melodious voice, cast aside its natural use when in prayer, suddenly assuming an unnatural tone and rapidity of utterance sufficient to surprise most of his intimate friends on hearing it for the first time?' Many clergymen are now agitating this same subject. Principle that binds this way and that at the sight of the almighty dollar is the spurious kind.
