QUEEN'S TOURMALINE GEM.

Washerwoman Saw Stone Shining in Creek.

Queen Alexandra has added a beautiful specimen of the Queensland tourmaline to her collection of gems. This stone was found by a washerwoman, who saw it shining in an Australian creek.
