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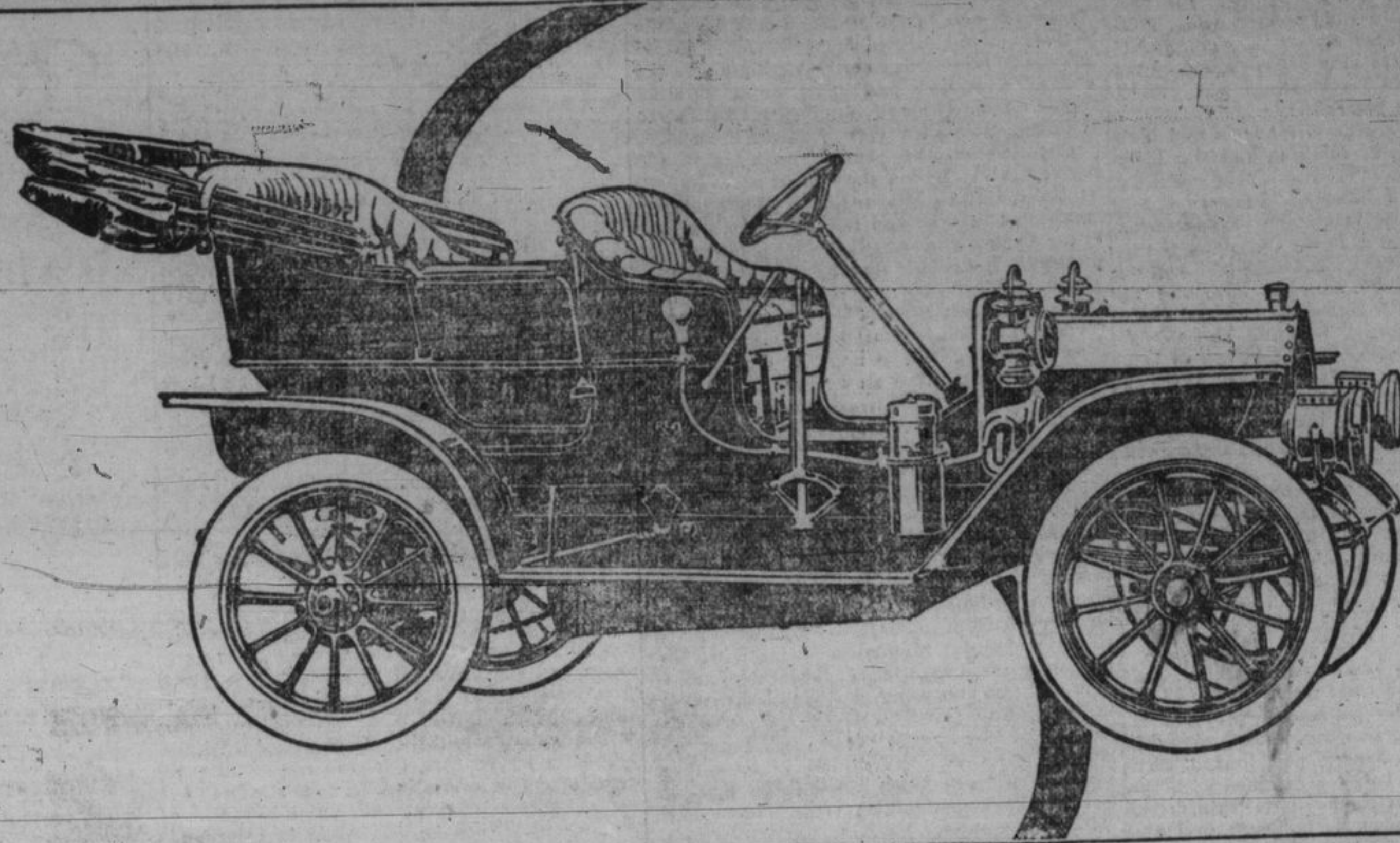

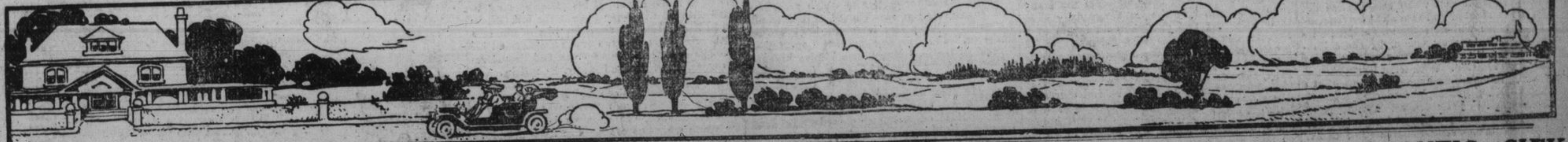

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VALUABLE RUSSIAN IMAGES.

Icons in the Kremlin Yield Much Gold.

The icons in the Cathedral of the Assumption in the Kremlin, at Moscow, are immensely valuable. They yielded about five tons of silver and five hundredweight of gold to the French soldiery in 1812, but this treasure was recovered by the Cossacks, who, in their gratitude, presented to the cathedral a silver chandelier weighing 900 pounds. The jewels with which the ikonostas is adorned are valued at \$125,000, a single emerald alone being worth \$50,000. This is a Bible so large that two studded with gold and emeralds and other stones. A sober estimate of the weight of gold used in the ikonostas, and vessels of this famous church alone places it at 100 hundredweight.

House With A Wrong Tablet.

A curious example of the mistakes of history comes down from Paris. For more than half a century a house of the Quai Conti has borne on the front a tablet with this inscription: "Historic Memorial. In 1783 the Emperor Napoleon Bonaparte, officer of artillery, or leaving the school of Brienne, lived at this house in the fifth story." The tablet was placed in position by his Majesty Napoleon III, on October 14, 1868.

After this great length of time it has been discovered that Napoleon never lived in the house, so the tablet has been removed. Only another instance of how our most cherished beliefs are shattered.

WHY PAINTED RED?

Iron or Steel Always Has Red Coating.

"Why is iron or steel invariably painted red?" This question has been asked by scores of men and women recently who have walked over Hungerford bridge on the way to Waterloo Station from Charing Cross. Workmen have been busy for some time painting the steel work of the structure a beautiful carmine.

In America it has been noticed that most of the skyscraper steel frames are first painted red and then some other color. This is also the case with steel bridges and ironwork of all kinds. One of the workmen on the Hungerford bridge job was asked why the bridge was being painted red.

"Oh, it's not the color that counts," he said, "but it's what the paint is composed of. This is red lead, and any steel man will tell you that red lead is the best preservative against dampness and rust. Recently a dark green lead has come into use as a first coat for iron and steel, but, after all, red lead seems to hold its own as a covering to preserve steel work. When the red lead is once on it the structure can be painted any other color to suit the taste. The red lead lasts years."

King Of Spain As Arbitrator.

King Alfonso is, perhaps, the youngest monarch who was ever selected to arbitrate on an international dispute, which in the present case is the difference between England and Germany with regard to the Walfisch bay territory. The late King of Sweden—by reason of his age, his philosophic mind and his disinterestedness from the wrangle of international politics—was repeatedly called upon to act as arbitrator, but it was his majesty's jurists who did the judicial work for him. No one expects King Alfonso himself, to study the question now submitted to him with a pot of strong tea at his side and cold bandages round his head.

Rename Traitor's Mansion.

The mansion in Fairmont Park Philadelphia, which was owned by Benedict Arnold and occupied by him when he was in command of the American troops in this city in the Revolutionary War, will be known hereafter as Mount Pleasant. The park commissioners have decided to remove Arnold's name from over the door and substitute a sign bearing the title by which it was known when owned by the McPherson family, who sold it to Arnold.
