### IT MAY BE THE LAST

## ASQUITH LIKELY TO HOLD ON TO OFFICE.

English Politicians Look For An Official Declaration Following This Week's Budget Disclosures. New York, April 27.—The Tribune's London correspondent cables: "What will probably be the last free trade budget in England will be disclosed next week, and the politicians will know whether a general election will be forced this year.

The Economist, makes the novel suggestion that the remnant of the existing land tax, yielding £70,000,000 can be cleared away by compulsory redemption, and from £16,000,000 to £20,000,000 can be obtained from it in the course of two years. This expedient would release the taxpayers from their temporary burthen, and abolish the charges which have become a nuisance to buyers and sellers. It would clear the ground for the new system of valuation and taxation on which the radicals have set their hearts, and would remove the justification for a rejection of the budget by the Lords.

The opinion prevails in the smoking-room at Westminster that the budget will be less sensational than has been expected, and that the government will remain in office through the year. Welsh disestablishment is a form of window dressing for the nonconformists. Financial and naval policies alone count in practical politics. The naval inquiry respecting the nation's readiness for war strengthens the position of the government.

Lord Charles Beresford has acted with dignity and patriotism in presenting the case before the secret Cabinet tribunal, refraining from panic-mongering. A most remarkable speech on naval subjects is from a rising hope of Toryism, F. E. Smith, who has condemned the beligerent right of seizing an enemy's ships in war time, and virtually has become the champion of the American principle of inviolability of private property at sea.

## PEDDLED MEDICINE

Prof. Kelley Had to Pay Total of \$120.

Midland, April 27.—Prof. P. T. Kelley, of the Shamrocks' Medicine and Concert company, certainly fell into hard luck when he landed in the town of Midland last week. On Monday Chief of Police Bell rounded him up under the transient traders' by-law and collected \$50 for a transient traders' license. Shortly afterwards it came to the ears of the Ontario Medical Association that he was practising medicine in an office on the stage of Gould's Opera House. Immediately they reported the matter to Chief of Police Bell, who laid a charge of illegal practice of medicine. The case came before Police Magistrate Jeffery on Saturday night, and Prof. Kelley, through counsel, D. S. Storey, pleaded guilty. The magistrate in imposing a fine of \$50 and costs, \$70 in all, said he hoped this would prove a deterrent to medicine peddlers in the future. Kelley left town a sadder but a wiser man.

## WAS FORMER KINGSTONIAN.

Michael J. Connelly Who Passed Away in Chicago. Michael J. Connelly died in Chicago, on March 18th, after a short illness, of twenty-one days, of a complication of diseases. He was very highly respected, being secretary of the Map Department of the city buildings of Chicago, also a professor of music, and will be much missed in musical circles. He was formerly a resident of Kingston, and the youngest son of the late Patrick Connelly, and brother of the late Capt. Connelly. He is survived by his mother, two sister and four brothers, Mrs. Connors, of Chicago; Mrs. D. F. McSorley, of Kingston; Patrick of Watertown; Timothy, James and George, of Chicago, who have the sympathy of a large circle of friends.

## Valuable Alberta Farms.

Calgary, Alta., April 27.—At Standoff, Southern Alberta, a farmer named Pearson, has refused \$75,000 for his 4,500 acre farm. He is holding for \$100,000. Many other sales are reported in the same district at from \$30 to \$40 per acre.

Negotiations have been closed between the Regina Lacrosse Club and "Newy" Lalonde, of Cornwall. "Newy" has accepted an offer of \$250 for the two games and will leave for the west on Sunday next. It is his intention to remain in the west country.

### Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either side or even numbered Sections South of township 45, East of the Calgary and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 26, and West of the third Meridian and the Sault Railway line. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL—West mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton. QUARTZ—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 feet. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with, the claim may be purchased at \$1.00 an acre. PLACER MINING CLAIMS—generally, 100 feet square. Fee, \$5.00. DREDGING—Two leases of five miles each of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$10 a mile per annum. Royalty, 24 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000.
