Young Williams is the inventor of both the wireless apparatus by which the explosion was caused, and the explosive, which is a new kind of powder, the making of which is his secret. He says the new explosive is forty and Illustrated Songs. times as strong as dynamite, and that with his apparatus he can cause an explosion as far away as Chicago. The blast that shook the city last night took only three ounces of the explosivo. Williams says he has entered into negotiations with government officials at Washington, with a view of
