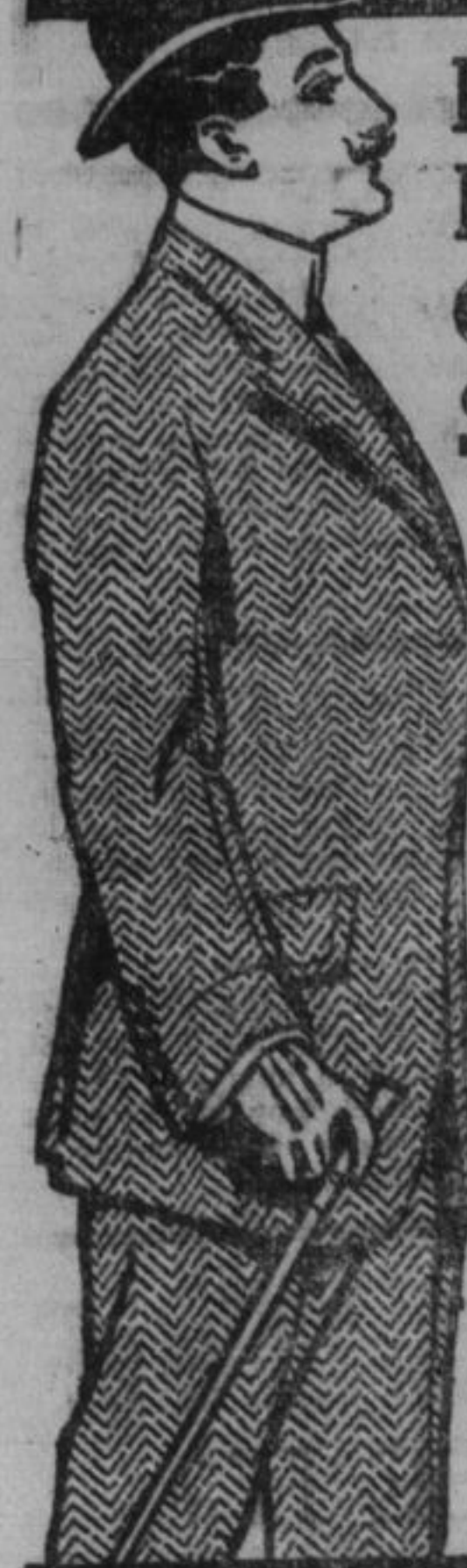

## THE PRICE OF LAND FIFTY CENTS PER FOOT ABOVE VALUE.

What was Disclosed at the Civic Enquiry—The Magog Cotton Mill Closed—Arranged Finances.

Montreal, May 6.—At the civic enquiry, to-day, a number of property experts gave evidence with reference to a lot of land which had been purchased by the city, on Upper St. Lawrence street, on which to erect No. 12 police station. The city paid at the rate of \$1.75 per foot, whereas, at the very highest, they should not have paid any more than \$1.25. According to the Star's cable, Messrs. Harris, president, and Canby, general manager, of the Nova Scotia Steel company, are sailing for home to-morrow, having made arrangements with respect to the financial plans of the company which are expected to be highly satisfactory. They went to England, some weeks ago, in connection with the re-organization.

## SHIPS TO PASS Through Panama Canal in Five Years.

Washington, May 6.—Representative Campbell, Kansas, who has returned from a trip to the Isthmus of Panama, called on President Taft and told him of the splendid progress that is being made on the canal. Mr. Campbell declares that he believes that ships would be passing through the canal in five years. He also declared that an unbiased inspection of the work by an expert showed that the lock-type of canal was much preferable to a sea level plan.

## MEN PLENTIFUL is the Report of the Lake Carriers' Association.

Detroit, Mich., May 6.—Reports having been circulated that only sixty of the Lake Carriers' Association boats are in commission because of the men's strike, President Livingstone, of the association, says there are, at the present time, 138 of the lake carriers' boats moving. Reports from Buffalo show that men are plentiful there, more than one hundred having been shipped there during the past week. Livingstone says, in obtaining cargoes for the boats.

## Sent To Penitentiary.

Stratford, Ont., May 6.—Aloysius Guerin, found guilty of manslaughter at the spring assizes, here, yesterday, in connection with the death of Alexander Sutherland, of West Zorra, under dead at the rear of Guerin's passenger car, on the Toronto and Stratford line, on February 22nd last, was sentenced, this morning, by Justice Tiddell, to five years in the penitentiary.

## A Fire At Bracebridge.

Bracebridge, Ont., May 6.—This morning the hardware store of G. W. Ecclestone was discovered on fire and two hours the firemen worked hard before the flames were under control. The loss will be probably in the neighborhood of \$15,000 or \$20,000 but is covered by insurance.
