DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a form of at least 200 acres and any live. farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarten section along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even numbered Sections South of township 45, East of the Caigary and Edmonton Railway and the West line of range 26, and West of the third Meridian and the Sault Railway line, Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres YNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH COAL .- Coal mining rights may leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2,560 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ.—A person eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1,500 feet by 1,500 et. Fee, \$5.00. At least \$100 must be spended on the claim each year,
