TO ENCOURAGE TRADE

WILL BONUS FISH FOR THE PRAIRIES.

Important Move By Dominion Government is Welcomed By Pacific Coast Fishermen.

Vancouver, B.C., May 18.—In order to encourage the development of the Canadian fishing industry on the Pacific coast, where the bounty system prevailing in the Atlantic maritime provinces does not obtain, the Dominion government recently passed an order-in-council granting a rebate of one-third of the express rates on all shipments of fresh fish billed from here by Canadian fishing companies or Canadian fishermen to any point in Alberta, Saskatchewan and Manitoba. This rebate or bonus applies to any variety of sea fish caught in Canadian waters, including salmon, halibut, oysters, crabs, and clams. Vancouver fishing firms and dealers are jubilant over the proposed system of rebates authorized at Ottawa. They declare that it will drive American competition out of the three provinces and will also tend to stimulate the consumption of sea fish there. The prairie market hitherto has been a small one, but with the rapid increase of population, is one of great possibilities.

SEEKS TREASURE

Left Long Ago in a Placer Field.

Colorado Springs, Colo., May 18.—In search for hidden treasure in the Andes mountains, which he claims will bring him untold wealth, Duvald Neumann, a Cripple Creek miner, left to-day, for New York. In a few days he will sail for South America.

Years ago Neumann, an itinerant prospector and globe trotter, discovered rich placer fields in Brazil. On his return to the United States he was taken sick, and upon his recovery went to work in the Cripple Creek mines to secure funds for his return to Brazil.

As a key to the hidden treasure he has always kept a map of his route from Rio Janeiro to the placer fields, which are located at the head of the Amazon river.

He intends to build his own boat with which he will traverse the entire length of the Amazon, and upon which he will load the golden treasure on the return trip.

PAY \$2,840 IN FINES.

Ontario's Treasury Receives a Goodly Contribution.

Cobalt, Ont., May 18.—Over fifty men and women were summoned, yesterday, for running blind pigs in Cobalt, and \$2,840 has already been paid in fines by sixteen defendants. Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section (160 acres, more or less) of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Land Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on behalf of the father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may 'live within limits of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

IN certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section along-side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate six acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a quarter section homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even-numbered Sections in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate six acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a quarter section homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even-numbered Sections in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate six acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a quarter section homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any available lands on either odd or even-numbered Sections in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate six acres extra.
