Gananoque, May 28.—The committee in charge of the celebration for Dominion day met last evening. Appropriations were made for the various departments of the work. On account of a hitch in the St. Lawrence Laces League schedule, no available terms can be secured for that date. Baseball will be the fore. A tennis road race, beginning at the race track, on the driving park and ending there, will be a prominent feature. Three horse races will be another drawing card. There will also be aquatic sports, vaudeville, two bands of music and three and one-half mile road race for boys under fourteen. Prizes to the amount of about \$2,000 will be offered.

School Books and Their Cost. Sarnia Observer.

Ontario has the conservatives in power in provincial affairs, and in Ontario the set of five school readers, larger and better books than those in either Alberta or Saskatchewan, will hereafter cost forty cents. School children there are given a reader and an arithmetic, but before a child in the fourth book can attend school it has to buy \$6.90 worth of books. But it is an easy matter to solve the school book question on the Ontario plan. The price can be made as low as the government chooses by paying as much of the cost of production out of the public revenue as it may deem advisable and leaving the balance only to be paid by purchasers of the books. Where the purchasers pay the entire cost, as in the other provinces of the dominion, the price to them is naturally higher.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations.

ANY PERSON WHO IS THE SOLE head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter section (60 acres), more or less, of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

DUTIES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may preempt a quarter section along-side his homestead, for \$3.00 per acre. Purchased homesteads may be acquired on any homesteads on either odd or even numbered Sections South of township 45. East of the Ontario and Edmonton Railways and the West line of range 26, and West of the third Meridian and the Bank Railway line. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTHWEST MINING REGULATIONS.

COAL.—Coal mining rights may be leased for twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1.00 an acre. Not more than 2500 acres can be leased to one applicant. Royalty, five cents per ton.

QUARTZ.—A person, eighteen years of age and over having made a discovery may locate a claim 1500 feet by 1500 feet. Fee \$1.00. At least \$100 must be expended on the claim each year, or paid to the Mining Recorder. When \$500 has been expended or paid and other requirements complied with the claim may be purchased for \$1.00 an acre. PLACER MINING CLAIMS generally, 100 feet square. Entry fee, \$5.00. DREDGING.—Two sections of five miles each, of a river may be issued to one applicant for a term of 20 years. Rental, \$1.00 a mile per annum. Entry fee, 24 per cent after the output exceeds \$10,000.
