BRITAIN'S COAL OUTPUT.

More Than a Quarter of Million Tons Mined in United Kingdom in 1907. It would seem, judging from last year's output from the mines and quarries of the United Kingdom, that there is little ground for the fear, sometimes expressed, that the coal resources of the country are giving out.

It will probably surprise many readers to learn that a quarter of the output of coal in the United Kingdom is exported to foreign countries. For instance, during 1907 about 10,750,000 tons from us, Germany 16,000,000, Italy 8,250,000, Netherlands and Sweden over 3,000,000 each, while Russia, Spain, Denmark, Egypt, and even the Argentine Republic purchased over 2,000,000 tons each from us.

Coal represents about 82 per cent. of the minerals raised, and other minerals, such as clay and shale, limestone, salt, sandstone, and slate, were valued at over \$400,000,000. Such are the values of products from the bowels of the earth.
