



Partial Eclipse To-Night. A partial eclipse of the sun, visible in this part of the world, will take place just before sunset this evening. In other words, the new moon will pass almost directly between the sun and this part of the earth, so that a part of the light and heat radiating from the sun will be cut off. The moon will pass across the sun's northern limb, covering about half of it. As sunset comes a little after eight o'clock, the end of the eclipse will not be seen here, but west of the great lakes the partial phase will be seen in its entirety.


