**OVER IN SCOTLAND****SPORT PAYS BETTER THAN
AGRICULTURE.**But for Revenue From Hunting
Privileges Scottish Farmers
Could Not Live, Says Mr. P.
H. Mackenzie.Ottawa, June 17.—P. H. McKenzie,
ex-M.P. for South Bruce and from 1902
to 1908 chairman of the agricultural
committee of the House of Commons,
has returned from England, where he
has been spending four months carrying
on a propaganda for the Canadian
immigration department. He found
general depression in Great Britain,
and says the Scottish Highland farm-
ers have suffered severely."Except for their revenue from
hunting privileges," he said, "many of
the landlords could hardly make ends
meet; as it is, they cannot afford to
make many needed improvements, and
as a rule the buyers get high prices for
their stock, but they pay high rents."Three pounds per acre is not an un-
usual rent, and, in addition to this,
there is a heavy annual charge for
fertilizers. The moorlands make ex-
cellent pasture for sheep, but the
landlords prefer to keep them for
grouse. Where the landlords let the
moorlands for sheep they require the
tenants to burn the heather in strips,
so as not to frighten away the grouse
