### A NEGRO BOY GONE SEARCH THE WOODS FOR MISSING LEPER.

Negro Escapes From New Jersey Almshouse—Camden Police Join Chase.  
 Camden, N. J., June 18.—Joseph Clark, a negro boy leper, has escaped from his prison on the grounds of the County Almshouse, where he has been confined for nearly a year, and there is some concern among the inhabitants of the section lying adjacent to the institution.  
 The leper's escape was not discovered until to-day and already searching parties have scoured the woods and fields in the vicinity of the almshouse twelve miles southeast of Camden, but no trace of the boy has been found.  
 The Camden police and health authorities have been notified and they, too, have joined in the hunt.

### FRANCES NOBLE.

A Maine Girl Captured By Indians in 1755.  
 Lewiston, Me., Journal.  
 No more thrilling or romantic story exists in the early history of Maine than that of the captivity of Frances Noble, who, together with a number of other unfortunates, was taken by the Indians from Swan Island, in the Kennebec river, in 1755. Her adventures while a prisoner read like a chapter from a historical novel, but they are well authenticated from documents in the state library here.  
 James Whidden, Frances Noble's maternal grandfather, was a captain of the colonial army at the taking of Cape Breton in 1755. He owned a tract of land on Swan Island, in the Kennebec, where he lived with his family. One of his daughters married Lazarus Noble, of Portsmouth, and the young couple lived on the island with her parents. The Indians had been accustomed to visit Cape Breton for purposes of trade. As a Whidden was stationed there to secure the inhabitants from attack in time of war, no uneasiness was ever felt concerning the savages.  
 One morning a little after daybreak two boys went out of the fort and left the gate open. The Indians were on the watch, and availing themselves of the opportunity, some nine of them slipped inside the enclosure. The settlers were upon them before they were covered, but there was no escape. Capt. Whidden and his wife retreated to the cellar and concealed themselves. Noble and his hired man met the Indians at the head of the stairs and fired upon them, wounding one in the arm. Strange to say, the fire was not returned. Let Noble, his wife, their seven children and Timothy Whidden and Mary Holmes were taken prisoners. The hired man and the two boys succeeded in making their escape.  
 The captives were hurried to the river, where they were securely bound. The Indians then returned to the house, cut open the feather beds, strewed the feathers about the fields and carried off all the silver and gold, and provisions they could find. It is supposed that they omitted to burn the house because of their suspicion that the captain and his wife, from whom they had received many favors in times of peace, were concealed in it. After the destruction of his property Capt. Whidden returned to his old home in Massachusetts, where he died shortly afterward.  
 The Indians also captured an old man named Pomeroy, who was busily engaged in making shingles on another part of the island.  
 Having collected their prisoners and plunder, the Indians immediately started on their long return trip to Canada, where they hoped to dispose of their prey. Pomeroy was old and feeble and unable to endure the fatigue of the march. On the morning of the second day he was knocked on the head with the butt of a musket and instantly killed. They were assiduous in their care of the child-ransom. Abigail, one of the youngsters, died before the journey was completed, but the rest of the captives reached Canada in safety and were variously disposed of.
