## ANOTHER OFFERS 11 HOLIDAYS FOR MILITIAMEN ARE GRANTED.

The Lake of the Woods Milling Company is Not To Be Done in the Matter of Patriotic Aid National Defense.

Montreal, Que., June 23.—The Lake of the Woods Milling Co. is not to be done in the matter of patriotism and national defence by any rival concern, Robert Meighen the president, announces that his company will employ two weeks holidays with full pay to attend annual drill in addition to their other holidays, if entitled to any. A short time ago the Ogilvie Milling company announced that employees would get an extra week with pay to attend annual camp drill. The Lake of the Woods company now moves the Ogilvie people one week better.

Rev. Dr. Workman, the deposed professor of the Wesleyan College, whose case for some time occupied a large place in Methodist church circles, on account of his alleged unorthodoxy, has entered a second action for damages against the college authorities. The first action was for \$5,000 for damages in charges made against him. Justification was pleaded by the college and the allegations that his teachings were not in conformity with the Methodist standards repeated. Prof. Workman claims that this constitutes a second libel, and he has entered an "incidental" action.

### SENT FOR TRIAL.

For Having Cruelly Abused Her Little Child.

Ottawa, June 23.—Canadian papers to-day say Sir Wilfrid Laurier in regard to the pure food act, it being requested that the government endeavor to have the provinces co-operate in legislation supplementary to the federal enactment. Consideration was promised.

In the Hull police court this morning Mrs. Nelson Lajoie, Aylmer, was committed for trial on the charge of cruelty in treating her ten-year-old daughter. Evidence went to show that abominable treatment had been inflicted on the little one, whose body was bruised, cut and emaciated when the authorities took her to a hospital. The ill-treatment had extended over a period of some months. The Georgian Bay Lumber company to-day bought for \$63,700, berth No. 2 on the Dokis Indian reserve, in the district of Nipissing. The sale was by public auction at the Russell House.

William Swift arrested here yesterday on the charge of trying to work a swindle in connection with a cold storage scheme, attempted suicide with morphine but was detected just after the dose, and by walking him about for a couple of hours the man's life was saved.

### HIS NAME TOO COSTLY.

Contractor Says It Meant Loss Of \$100,000 A Year.  
New York, June 23.—"I love my name, judge, but it costs me lots of money to keep it," John Vincent Smolensky told Judge Guy in the supreme court yesterday, in support of an application to have his name changed to John Vincent Smolen.  
Mr. Smolensky, who is a member of the building contracting firm of J. Harry Nicholson & Co., said that owing to the oddity of his name he had lost \$100,000 a year for 45 years.

"The name," he said, "interferes with my business progress, frequently and continuously preventing me from procuring interviews with persons who have valuable building contracts to give out. In fact, entire lines of business circles is practically closed to me because of this name."  
Mr. Smolensky gave the court the history of his life, after which Judge Guy granted his application.

### A BIG DEATH LIST.

At Mines In Pennsylvania Following Explosion.  
Wehrum, Pa., June 23.—Several men are reported dead and many injured as the result of an explosion at the mine of the Lackawanna Coal and Coke Company. Over one hundred men were at work in the mine, including the foreman and other officials, and heads of departments.  
At 9:30 o'clock but a few of these had come out or had been brought out of the mine, it is stated there probably will be a large death list. At this hour details are lacking.  
Later—Two men are dead and half a dozen others injured.

Shaken By Earthquake.  
Chicago, Cal., June 23.—The entire Sacramento Valley is recovering its composure, to-day, following a severe earthquake shock which shook every town in the valley about 12:50 o'clock last night. Besides the shaking down of chimneys, little damage was done by the tremor, which lasted fifteen seconds. The shock was most severe at Marysville, Grass Valley and Nevada City.

Hurt In A Runaway.  
Brampton, Ont., June 23.—W. Large and E. Bailey, plumbers, of this town, were driving to Huttonville, this morning, when the horse ran away, upsetting the rig and severely injuring both men. Large had a leg broken and was badly bruised, while Bailey sustained a broken arm and other injuries.

Drowned In A Tub.  
Hamilton, Ont., June 23.—Loren Davis McDonough, the one-year-old daughter of David McDonough, climbed up on a tub in the bathroom, in an effort to get a piece of stick floating in the water, when she toppled inwards with her face in the water, and was drowned.
