HAD A LONG CHASE

CROSSED AFRICA BEFORE HE WAS CAUGHT.

He Reached London in Safety After a Long Tramp—Was in Desperate Plight.

After escaping from custody in Rhodesia by jumping from a train, tramping 1500 miles across Africa, and reaching London in safety after desperate adventures, a man named John Creswick has fallen into the clutches of the law through a tattoo mark on his arm. The story of his extraordinary adventures was told at Bow street, when he was charged with being an escaped convict. Creswick, who is a sailor, was sentenced to six years' penal servitude in Rhodesia for forgery and was sent from Gwelo to Salisbury by train, guarded by a number of police, and with his ankles heavily manacled. By some means he eluded the vigilance of his guards and reached the depot while it was traveling at twenty miles an hour. He was not missed for a few minutes, during which he managed to get rid of his manacles by breaking the steel rivets with a piece of rock, and made good his escape.

His plight, however, was a desperate one. He was without food, arms, or money, and in constant danger from prowling lions. By an extraordinary coincidence he met a friend, who supplied him with a rifle and ammunition and lent him money. Creswick then set out to walk to Boma, in the Congo Free State, a distance of 1500 miles, through the heart of the continent. For five months he tramped, living on animals and birds he killed with his gun. Several times he nearly starved, and he had countless narrow escapes from death. Finally he reached Boma, and changing his tattered prison dress for a pair of grey trousers, a striped jacket, and a cricket shirt, he took passage in a steamer for Antwerp. Thence he came to London, and when arrested he at first denied his identity. But when the inspector asked to see his arm, to ascertain whether the Prince of Wales's feathers were tattooed upon it, he admitted he was the man wanted. He was remanded to Bow street. He was remanded pending the decision of the authorities as to what shall be done with him.

Australia's New Ship.

Sydney is legitimately jubilant over the construction of the Endeavor, the ship designed for fishery investigation in the service of the Commonwealth Government. Her hull will include no fewer than eight thousand miles of coast line. She has been constructed in the New South Wales Government dockyard, and her completion is a notable event in the history of Australian shipbuilding. New South Wales is the fortunate possessor of excellent iron deposits, and is well supplied with the necessary facilities for the construction of ships. The Endeavor must be a good and stout craft if she is prepared to encounter the occasionally very rough weather off the Australian coasts, more especially in the Bight. The expense saved in taking ships out from Great Britain is expected to cover any increased cost of local construction, and the opinion is expressed by a competent critic that in the near future it may even prove cheaper to build torpedo-destroyers "down under" for the requirements of Australia than to send them out from England.

Germany's First Lady Doctor.

One of the interesting women to be present at the coming congress of the International Council of Women, is Dr. Tiburtius, Germany's first lady doctor. When Dr. Tiburtius made up her mind that she should study medicine no German universities were open to women, so it became necessary for her to leave home and study in Switzerland. She became a successful physician, and practiced in Berlin for over thirty years, but has now retired. When Miss Hilda Martindale, Government factory inspector of Dublin, Ireland, was chosen to give an address at the congress, it was necessary for her to procure permission from the Home Government before she could speak in public. This permission has been granted, with the special request that Miss Martindale take for her subject "The Child in Industry." She will also speak on Women Inspectors.

Synopsis of Canadian North-West Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Six months' residence upon the cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to secure homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$300.00.
